Report- NSS RESIDENTIAL CAMP 2024-2025.

Event: NSS RESIDENTIAL CAMP 2024-2025.

Date: 13th November, 2024 to 19th November, 2024.

Objectives: The main motto is to work on Health, Women Empowerment, Education in the Zilla Parishad School based on theme Youth for My Bharat and Digital Literacy.

Highlight: The NSS Unit of our College organized the NSS Residential camp at Kelni Village, Murbad Highway Road, Titwala-East. This 7-day residential Camp was organized to work on Health, Women's Empowerment, and Education in the Zilla Parishad School also focusing on digital literacy in the village and connecting the village to urban areas through different activities and events. The camp begin with the inauguration, traditional lighting of the lamp ceremony, symbolising the dispelling of ignorance and spreading of knowledge. The dignitaries gracing the occasion were:

Dr. Vijay Vishwakarma, the Programme Officer, welcomed everyone and briefly introduced the camp's objectives. Dr. Tushar S, IT Coordinator, highlighted the importance of teamwork and technology in today's world. Mr. Prajesh Trotsky, the Guest of Honour, delivered an impactful speech, emphasizing the importance of NSS in shaping responsible citizens. He spoke about how the program instils leadership, social responsibility, and empathy in students.

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Following these numerous activities took place, the **Project Pragati** initiative fostered holistic development among school students of **Zilla Parishad School in Kelni and Kolimb**. Spanning several days, the camp engaged students in educational, creative, and recreational activities, addressing key areas of personal growth, skill-building, and awareness. Specific Volunteers were assigned to schools to make sure the activities planned in school were executed properly.

It began with an **Aptitude Test (Bhaudik Parikshan)** to evaluate students' cognitive abilities and provide insights for personalised guidance. A session on **Self-Defence** equipped students, particularly girls, with techniques to enhance their confidence and ensure their safety. It also included a **Computer Literacy Program**, offering students hands-on experience with basic technological skills to encourage digital empowerment.

An interactive session on **Good Touch and Bad Touch** focused on teaching students about personal safety and setting boundaries. Creative workshops such as **Nukkad Natak** and **Singing** helped students explore their talents while promoting confidence and teamwork. A dedicated session on **Healthy Food Habits** and **Hygiene** emphasized the importance of nutrition and cleanliness in daily life. It also featured a **Drawing Competition**, providing students with a platform to express their creativity on socially relevant themes. A **sports day** was organized in **Kelni** and **Kolimb** to encourage physical fitness, teamwork, and sportsmanship of the students, while the grand **Annual Day celebration** served as the culmination of the camp, with students showcasing their talents in music, dance, and drama, reflecting their growth and confidence.

The other initiative of the camp was **Shramdaan**, This was designed to promote environmental consciousness, community engagement, and the values of service and sustainability. These activities inspire collective responsibility towards

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maintaining cleanliness, fostering greenery, and improving community infrastructure. Key activities included **Swachhta Rallies** and **Cleanliness Drives** in the villages of Kelni and Kolimb. The rallies raised awareness about proper waste management, hygiene practices, and environmental care, while the cleanliness drives involved clearing public spaces, segregating waste, and visibly improving the surroundings.

Additionally, the **beautification of the Zilla Parishad School** was undertaken. Volunteers cleaned the premises, painted walls, and created vibrant murals with educational themes, transforming the school into a more engaging and welcoming space for students. These visually engaging designs, featuring alphabets, numbers and environmental themes, were intended to make learning more enjoyable and stimulating for students. Volunteers also **Planted Trees** in surrounding of the school of the school.

A **Tree Plantation Drive** at the campsite promoted environmental conservation. Volunteers planted native tree saplings, emphasizing the importance of greenery in combating climate change and improving the ecosystem. These saplings included species known to improve air quality, reduce soil erosion, and provide habitats for local wildlife.

As part of the NSS Special Residential Camp 2024, the **Community Visit Program (CVP)** was designed to bridge the gap between volunteers and the local community through direct interaction and data collection. The focus of this program was on understanding the socio-economic conditions and challenges faced by farmers in the villages through the **Farmers Field Survey** and **Income Survey**.

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Farmer's Field Survey, this activity involved visiting agricultural fields and engaging directly with farmers to gain insights into their farming practices and challenges. Volunteers interacted with farmers to understand the types of crops grown, irrigation methods used, and issues related to soil health and pest control. Data was collected on the availability and use of modern agricultural tools, fertilizers, and sustainable practices. Farmers also shared their concerns about unpredictable weather patterns, water scarcity, and the impact of climate change on crop yields.

The **Income Survey** focused on assessing the economic status of the local community beyond farming. Volunteers collected information on Sources of income for villagers, including agriculture, local businesses, and daily wage. Employment rates, seasonal income variations, and the impact of external factors. Financial challenges faced by villagers, such as irregular income, limited access to credit, and lack of savings.

Two significant **Sessions** were held in the **village** aimed at raising awareness and providing the community with valuable knowledge for betterment in health, education, and sustainability. **Dr. Akansha Mohite** conducted an informative session for parents on **Neurodiversity in Children**. The session aimed to educate parents about various neurological conditions like autism, ADHD, and dyslexia, emphasizing the importance of early identification and intervention.

Ms. Shrisha Yeotikar led a session on **Sustainable Menstruation**, where she introduced the women of the village to the environmental and health concerns associated with conventional menstrual products. She highlighted the ecological impact of disposable pads and tampons and promoted eco-friendly alternatives such as menstrual cups. Practical demonstrations were provided to help women make informed choices about their menstrual hygiene.

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A series of enriching **Sessions designed to equip Volunteers** with valuable knowledge, skills, and perspectives in a variety of fields. These sessions were conducted by experts from diverse areas and aimed at enhancing both personal development and social awareness among the volunteers. The sessions covered topics ranging from personal growth to social issues, practical skills, and awareness about important environmental and technological concerns.

Session on Life and NSS by Mr. Prajesh Trotsky, He discussed the core values of NSS, including selfless service, social responsibility, and community development. The session emphasized how volunteers could transform their personal lives through active participation in community service and contribute to the nation's growth. **Mr. Gajanan Patil**, a food safety expert, conducted a **Session on Food Adulteration**, its impact on health, and how to identify and prevent it. Volunteers learned about the types of adulterants commonly found in food, methods of detection, and the importance of consumer awareness in ensuring food safety.

Mr. Avadhesh Yadav, a renowned personality development coach, conducted an interactive **Session** focusing on building self-confidence. The session provided practical tips and techniques for improving personal and professional growth, preparing volunteers to present themselves with confidence and develop key attributes for success. **Asst. Prof. Suvitha Sukumaran**, an expert in career counselling, led a **Session focused on interview preparation and essential skills** for professional success. Volunteers were taught how to improve their interview performance, build a strong resume, and develop skills such as communication, critical thinking, and problem-solving.

Asst. Prof. Vinay Shahapurkar conducted a **Session** on the growing issue of **cyberbullying**, educating volunteers about its impact on mental health and

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society. The session covered the types of cyberbullying, prevention strategies, and how to support victims. **Mr. Sachin Patil**, facilitated a **street play workshop** where volunteers learned the art of storytelling and performance to address social issues. The session included techniques for acting, scriptwriting, and message delivery, equipping volunteers for effective social awareness and change.

Mr. Dutta Bombe, a wildlife conservationist, conducted an educational **Session** on the importance of snakes in the ecosystem and the correct methods of rescuing them. Volunteers were taught how to safely handle snake-related incidents, promote conservation efforts, and dispel myths and misconceptions surrounding snakes. **Mr. Vijay Gawde** provided insights into the qualities of effective leadership, including decision-making, team management, and motivational skills. Through group activities and case studies, volunteers learned how to take initiative, inspire others, and develop their leadership potential.

Mr. Sushil Shinde, Officer on Special Duty (OSD) at the NSS Cell, University of Mumbai, visited the campsite and interacted with the volunteers, sharing his experiences and insights into the NSS's role in student development and community service. He encouraged the volunteers to actively participate in NSS activities, highlighting the impact of their contributions to both personal growth and society.

Mr. Swapnil Shirsath and **Mr. Raju Koli** led a **Session** aimed at **debunking superstitions** and encouraging rational thinking. Volunteers were educated on the dangers of superstition in society and provided with tools to promote scientific reasoning and critical thinking, especially in rural and underserved communities. **Mr. Govind Modanwal** conducted an informative session on the importance of safeguarding personal information online. The session covered topics such as data

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privacy, safe online practices, protection against cyberattacks, and how to stay secure while navigating the internet.

Mr. Akshay and **Mr. Abhishek** led a session on the ethical and safe ways to rescue and rehabilitate animals in distress. Volunteers learned how to handle emergency animal rescue situations, promote animal welfare, and support local animal rescue organizations in their efforts.

A range of impactful **Awareness Activities** were conducted to educate and empower the community on pressing social, health, and environmental issues. Volunteers engaged with the villagers through creative and direct initiatives, addressing topics like voting rights, health awareness, digital literacy, and sustainable practices.

Awareness on the **Importance of Voting** was a key focus, with activities including **Rallies** in **Kelni** and **Kolimb**, **Door-to-Door campaigns**, and **engaging Streetplay**. These efforts highlighted the significance of active participation in the democratic process and encouraged villagers to exercise their right to vote responsibly. Similarly, **Streetplay** on topics such as **HIV/AIDS**, **Women Empowerment**, **gender equality** and **Swachh Bharat (Clean India)** were performed to educate the community in an engaging and relatable manner. These plays effectively conveyed critical messages on health, sanitation, and social equality. Volunteers conducted **Door-to-Door Awareness Campaigns** to address important issues such as **HIV/AIDS**, **Blood Donation**, **Substance Abuse** (nasha mukti) and **Gender Equality**. These personal interactions allowed for tailored discussions, breaking stigmas and fostering understanding of these sensitive topics. Additionally, **Rallies on Gender Equality** and **Nasha Mukti** brought together community members, creating a collective voice advocating for a healthier and more equitable society.

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To enhance digital and financial literacy, **Computer Literacy for adults** and an awareness of **Mobile Banking** were organized. These empower villagers with basic technological skills and access to online financial services, thereby promoting digital inclusion and economic independence. Environmental sustainability was also addressed through the distribution of **Newspaper Bags**, encouraging the community to adopt eco-friendly alternatives to plastic.

A **Health Check-Up Camp** was organized to provide essential medical services to the local community. The camp offered basic health screenings and consultations, ensuring that villagers had access to healthcare facilities and guidance. Medical professionals conducted check-ups for common health issues, focusing on preventive care and early diagnosis, while volunteers assisted in the smooth organization of the event leading **66 – Beneficiaries**. In addition to the camp, volunteers conducted a **Door-to-Door Awareness** to inform the villagers about the importance of regular health check-ups.

Volunteers organized a **Donation Drive** in multiple locations to address specific needs and promote social welfare. **Sports kits and educational kits** were distributed to children in the villages of **Kolimb, Kelni, and Ankharpada**, encouraging active participation in sports and academics. Additionally, **Sanitary Pads** were donated to promote menstrual hygiene, addressing a crucial aspect of women's health and breaking societal taboos around the topic.

Essential **Food Grains** were donated to the **village** community to support families in need and to a **Nasha Mukti Kendra** (Rehabilitation Center) to assist in their efforts to help individuals recovering from substance abuse. A **Clothes Donation Drive** was also conducted at Kolimb, providing garments to those in need, and reinforcing the spirit of sharing and care within the community. A range of thoughtful donations were made, including **45 sanitary pads, 3 sports kits, 100**

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water bottles, 100 tiffin boxes, 71 stationery kits, 1500 paper bags, 4 cartons of clothes, over 50 kg of food rations, 60 trees planted, and 51 school bags.

Volunteers actively participated in daily activities that promoted discipline, teamwork, and cultural expression. Every morning began with invigorating sessions of **Running, Exercise, Yoga and Morning Assembly** fostering physical fitness and mental well-being among the participants. These activities not only energized the volunteers but also instilled a sense of routine and mindfulness, enhancing their overall camp experience. The volunteers were also engaged in **Group Tasks**, which encouraged collaboration, problem-solving, and collective responsibility. In the evenings, the camp came alive with vibrant **Cultural Performances**, where volunteers showcased their talents through singing, dancing, and dramatics.

The camp concluded with a vibrant **Valedictory Function**, marking the culmination of a week of impactful activities and dedicated community service. A **Certificate Distribution Ceremony**, where all participants were awarded certificates as a token of appreciation for their commitment and hard work throughout the camp. Special recognition was given to standout performers with awards for the **Best Male Camper, Best Female Camper, and Best Group**, highlighting their exceptional leadership, teamwork, and dedication.
