



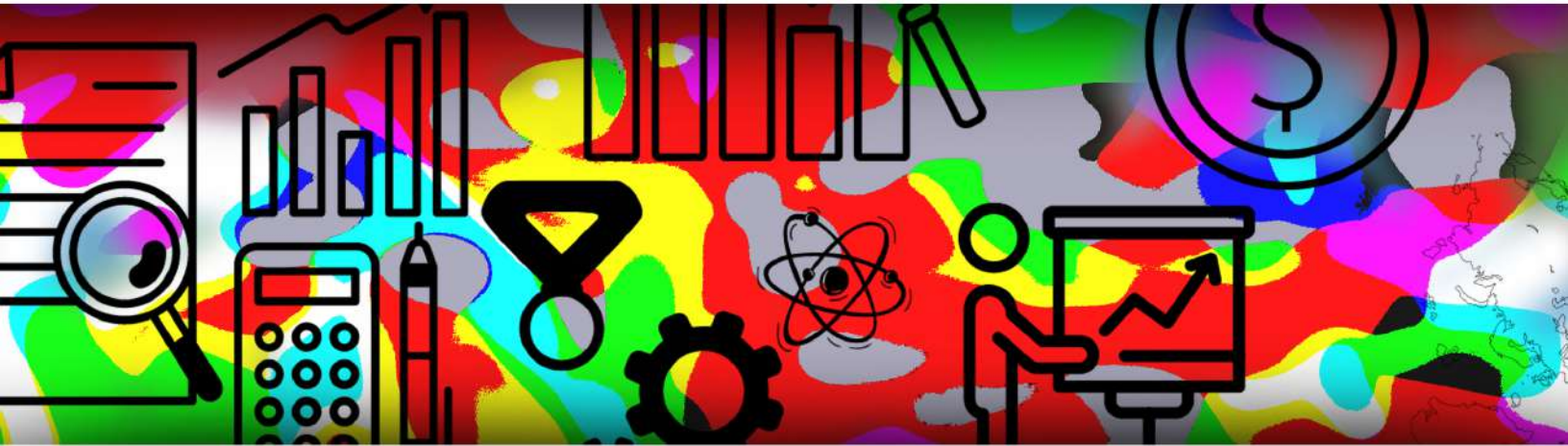

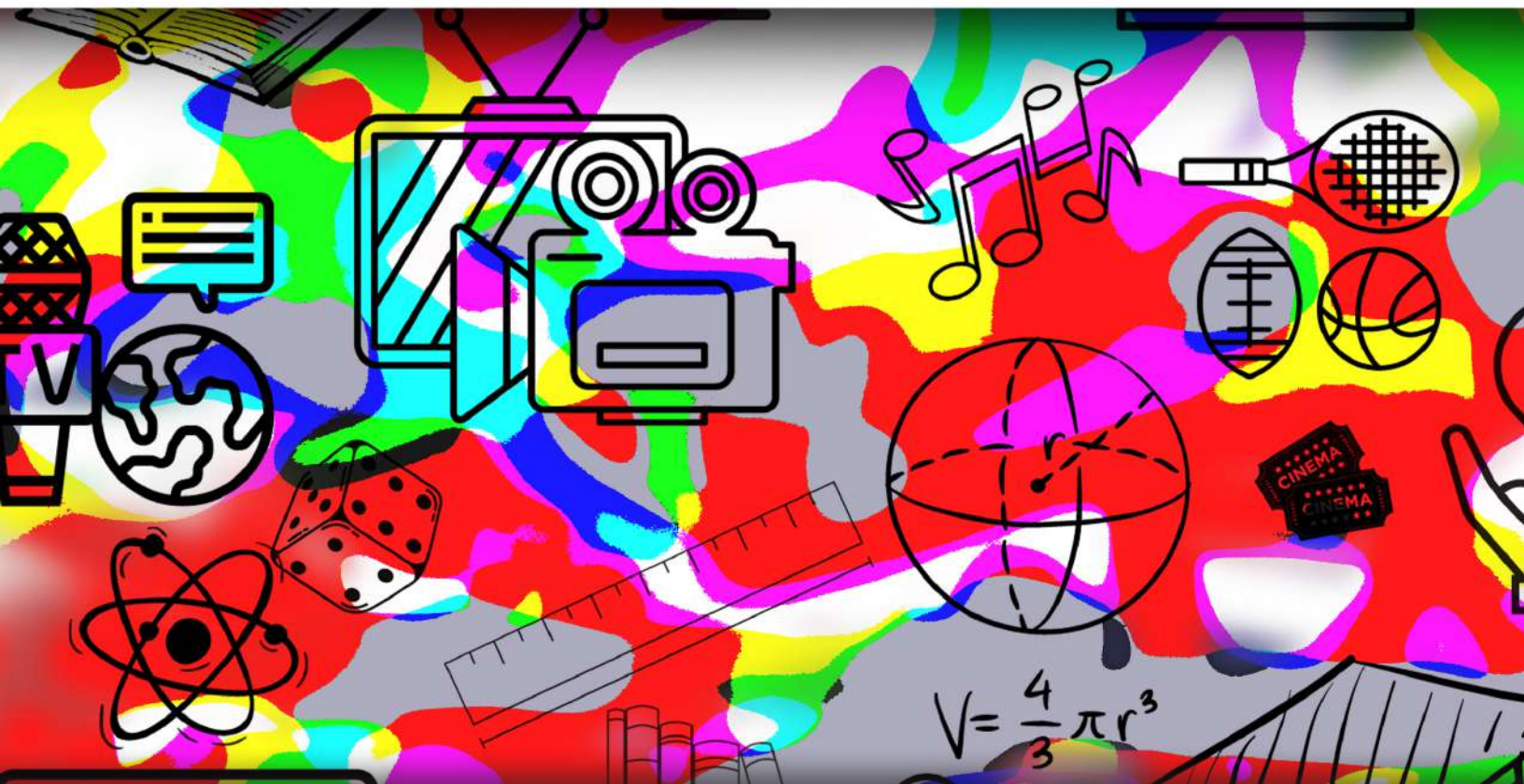

# ANNUAL REPORT

## Students, Programmes and Faculty

The college currently offers undergraduate programmes in .Com, B.Com. (Banking and Insurance), B.Com.(Accounting and Finance), BMS, B.Sc. (IT), BAMMC and post-graduation programmes in M.Com.(Advanced Accountancy), M.Com.(Business Management), M.Sc.(IT) and Ph.D. programme leading to Ph.D degree in commerce field. The total strength of the college stood at 2560 which is an all-time high number. All programmes are filled to the sanctioned capacity of University of Mumbai. Currently, there are in all 35 full time Assistant Professors, 27 visiting faculty and 20 non-teaching staff and 6 general administrative staff on the roll. During the academic year we have added one more programme B.Sc. Data Science at the UG level with sanctioned intake of 60 students.

## Affiliation and Accreditation

The degree college has obtained the most awaited recognition u/s 2(f) from UGC, New Delhi. The NAAC accreditation process is going on and the NAAC Peer Team is going to visit the college for accreditation on 27th and 28th June, 2023.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college is to ensure and enhance the quality of education and various other aspects of institutional functioning. This annual reports is to summarize the activities and achievements during the academic year 2022-23

**Second cycle of NAAC:** College was in due for the completion of second cycle of NAAC. The academic year 2022-23 was dedicated for the preparation of submission of NAAC SSR. College could successfully submit Institutional Information on Quality Accreditation (IIQA) on 16th December 2022. And submitted SSR on 10th February 2023. We could deal with all queiries of DVV and submit it on 6th March 2023. We have completed the dates of our choice of team visit which is due in the month of June or July.

**Collaborations:** Collaborative activities were conducted in association with Saraswat College, Goa. Saraswat College has organised a national level conference on intensifying financial literacy in India – Relooking strategy', held on 13th April 2023. Two faculty members presented papers in the conference.

College entered into collaboration with Devjyot Pyramid meditat Faculty members were organised on 19th November 2022. In all 12 teachers presented papers on the relevant domain.

**Certificate Courses:** College could successfully complete 13 certificate courses for the academic year 2022-23.

**Faculty Development Programmes: -**

**Induction Programme:** Induction programme for the newly recruit was conducted on 9th July 22. The new recruits were introduced to the organization culture, policies, teaching methodologies and National Education Policy 2020.

**Teachers as Counselors:** The first session was taken by Ms.Natasha Mehta, counselor for the college to the faculty members on nurturing the young adults in the classrooms. Session was held on 14th February, 2023. All faculty members attended the same.

Training on Outcome Based Education: Outcome based education was introduced to the staff in the earlier years too. To upgrade and sharpen it IQAC has organised another session on Cos and POs on 20th June 2022.and the Resource Person was our own Vice Principal CS Sandesha Shetty. The session was very fruitful.

National level webinar on ITR filing for the Assessment Year 2021-22 w.r.t. individual assesses was organised in association with The Department of Accountancy and Financial Management 24th December, 2021. The resource







persons were Mr. Sairaj Shetty and Shashmith Shetty (our Alumni), Tax consultants. In all, 97 participants attended the webinar. 'The art of meditation was organized on 22nd September, 2022. This workshop for stimulating brain with exercises was organized for teaching and non-teaching staff of our college. The resource person was B.D.Rambabu from (Guruji In-charge) Devjyot Pyramid Meditation Center (Mulund). **NAAC Preparations:** One day training session was organized on 7th December, 2022. One day training was conducted covering all the 7 criteria and Data Verification and Validation (DVV). Dr. Narendra Chotaliya from Rajkot was invited to deliver the session.

**Fire Safety training:** Fire safety training for the staff was conducted on 7th January, 2023. The fire marshal team for Fire force gave training for the same. All staff members attended the same.

Session on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) in association with National IP Awareness Mission as a part of Azadi ke Amritostav was organized on 5th March 2022. Resource Person was Ms. Ujjwal Jaipal Singh – Examiner of Patents and Design – Indian Patent Office.

**Participation in NIRF:** College has participated in National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2020 and the report was uploaded on college website.

# National Service Scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme (NSS) Report – 2022 – 23

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a Central Sector Scheme of Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. The NSS Unit of Bunts Sangha's S.M.Shetty College of Science, Commerce and Management Studies Powai consists of 2 units of 150 volunteers, where they must complete 120 hours of service at University level, College level and at the adopted area. This Unit comprises Principal - Dr. Sridhara Shetty as the Chairman, Dr. Vijay Vishwakarma, Asst. Prof. John Menezes and Asst. Prof. Dipti Parab are the Programme Officers, Ms Ayesha Khan - NSS Representative, Mr. Abhijeet Patil - General Secretary, Mr. Mayur Shewale NSS Asst. Representative and Mr. Samay Shah - Red Ribbon Club (RRC) Leader.

With the Motto "Not Me But You" our NSS unit has focused on Health, Education & Women Empowerment related activities divided into four Levels: Area Based 1, Area Based 2, College Level, University Level. The NSS unit conducted an orientation program for new volunteers on National Service Scheme (NSS) Foundation Day that is on 24th September, 2022.

Types Of Yakshagana:

Yakshagana is divided into two types that are Moodalpaya and Padavalapaya. Moodalapaya is the old form of Yakshagana dance and is still practiced in villages where the lead singer lives.

Paduvalapaya, on the other hand, is the popular version of Yakshagana in Karnataka.

Where can we watch Yakshagana in Karnataka?

Here are some suggestions on where to watch Yakshagana dance in Karnataka and many other

places are there to see mostly various temples and villages also have their own troupes and host

Yakshagana performances regularly. Dharmasthala temple in Mangalore the temple town of

Kateel. There are a number of Yakshagana training institutes as well such as Yakshagana Kendra in Udupi

The Yakshagana season is from January to May and also happens during the Navratri season.
