Let me thank each and everyone from the team for the great support and assure you that we are always there with you in your good work.

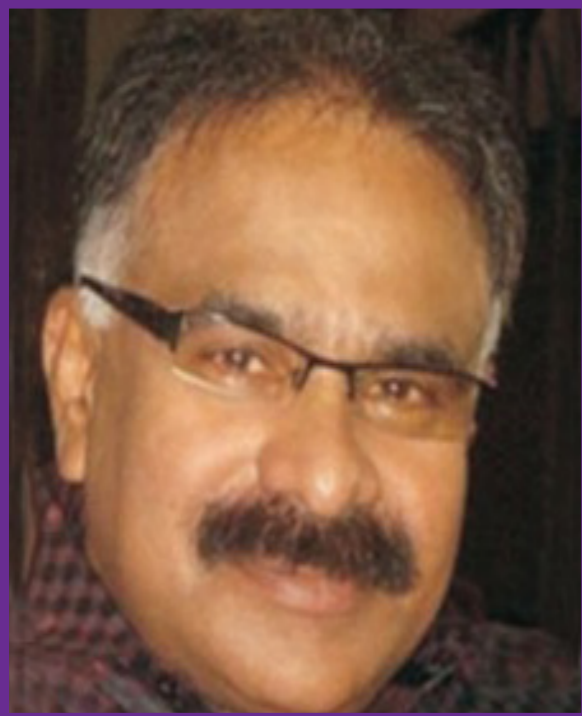

# ANNUAL REPORT

Shetty and office bearers of Powai Education Committee, Office Bearers of Bunts Sangha Mumbai, Trustees, Invitees, Teachers, Students, Parents and Ladies & Gentlemen.

I am very much pleased to place before you the annual report of the college for the academic year 2019-20.

We believe that imparting education should not just end up in offering academic degrees, but more importantly, to unleash the human potential within every student. The higher educational institutions have to respond appropriately and timely to the demand, preferences, and expectations of the employment market on the one hand and the society on the other. The higher educational institutions have to deliver quality, relevance, and excellence to stay ahead of times.

In this Annual Report, I have covered the main areas and events and the departmental events and developments covered in the respective coordinator's report.

Students, Programmes and Faculty

The academic year 2019-20 of the Degree College commenced on June 6, 2019. The college currently offers under graduation programmes in B.Com. B.Com. (Banking & Insurance), B.Com.(Accounting& Finance), BMS,B. Sc.(IT), BMM and post-graduation programmes in as M.Com and M.Sc.(IT) and aPh.D. centre in commerce. The total student strength of the college stood at 2300 students.All programmes are filled to the sanctioned capacity of University of Mumbai.Currently, there are in all 35 full time Assistant Professors, 23visiting faculty and14non- teaching staff including 6 General Administrative Staff on the roll.The college has a full time physical director and also a full time counselor for the benefit of students.

Results

Due to pandemic, University of Mumbai has changed the mode of examination from offline to online. In all the programmes, both UG and PG college has secured 100% (cent percent) results. I congratulate students and teachers for securing cent percent results.

## Fee Concession

Ours is a Kannada linguistic minority institution. The college provides fee concession to the most deserving

and economically poor students of the community and other than the community. In this academic year, we have provided fee concession of around Rs.23,57,821 to students at the degree level.

## Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The IQAC of S. M. Shetty College of Science, Commerce and Management Studies is the quality guardian that strives to maintain standards in every aspect of academic and administration. It constantly works towards the realization of quality enhancement in teaching, learning, research and extension.

IQAC has begun the activities of the academic year by releasing the theme of the year as "Greening the Blue with Millennials" and has taken the activities around the theme. The major areas of activities undertaken by IQAC include National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), ISO Certification 9001:2015, annual submission of AQAR to NAAC, National Conference, International Conference and student and teachers feedback analysis. The other activities conducted by IQAC include the following: Collaborations with Premier institutions in India, Workshop for Non-teaching staff on 'Admissions and Enrolment in association with University of Mumbai, Parental Workshop, Annual Alumni Meet and Faculty Development Programme.

## LEARNING RESOURCE CENTER (LRC)

Library at Bunts Sangha's S.M. Shetty College of Science, Commerce and Management Studies, Powai truly lives up to its name of 'Learning Resource Center' by providing a variety of information resources for teaching, learning and research. The library is fully air-conditioned and the overall ambience of the library is very conducive for learning with 12 hours of library timing. The library possesses both print and e-resources to satisfy the information needs of its users, i.e. staff and students. The current collection of the degree college section is 13,807 volumes of books, 2,177 books in book bank, 57 periodical titles and 13 newspapers along with a globe, few maps and CD-ROMs. In-house operations of the library are automated through SOUL Library Software. The library has subscription to N-LIST e-resource database (by UGC - INFLIBNET), through which students and teachers can access many electronic resources like full-text of more than 6000+ e-journals and 31,35,000+ e-books. Students are provided with 15 computers in the library with internet facility for their study and research purpose. In addition to this, Wi-Fi connectivity is also provided to the

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students. The library also offers book bank facility to the economically weak students. The library has membership to Tata Institute of Social Sciences Library. Other facilities include online catalogue of the library collection, and customized access to many subject related online resources through Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ). Latest news and additions to the library is conveyed through a LED screen kept in the library. The Library houses a separate Teacher's Corner for teachers where 7 computer terminals are provided along with 1 printer and 1 printer-cum-scanner. Online catalogue of the library, 'OPAC' enables users to search for resources available in the library. To keep the teaching fraternity abreast with the latest developments in their field, the library provides contents page service of current periodicals on a regular basis. News alert through WhatsApp is provided to the teachers daily. Students are guided in their search for information as well as information resources by the library staff, as and when needed. Digital Repository created by the library offers access to past years question papers and other online resources. To inculcate good reading habits amongst the students, various events like Book Review Competitions, Book Displays, Book Exhibition etc. are arranged by the library. This year the annual library book exhibition was held on 28th September, 2018. Around 3000 books were displayed in the exhibition. The library conducts orientation programmes and library awareness programmes on a regular basis. Apart from this the library provides a variety of services to its users. Library is secured by 5 CCTV cameras and 2 fire extinguishers. 'Voracious Reader' award of the library is given very year during the college Annual Day function. This academic year the library organized a National Conference on the theme 'Re-engineering Academic Libraries : Traditional to Smart'. Dr. Satish Kanamadi, librarian of TISS, was the keynote speaker. Many research papers were received for the conference which was published in the journal titled 'International Journal of Advance and Innovative Research' which has an impact factor of 7.36.

## Research Centre in Commerce

University of Mumbai has approved Ph.D. centre in the faculty of Commerce and in the subject 'Business Policy and Administration' leading to Ph.D. degree from October 2017 onwards. Currently, five research scholars are pursuing their Doctoral Programme which is duly approved by Research Review Committee (RRC) of University of Mumbai from our centre. Principal, Dr. Sridhara Shetty is

guiding the research scholars. The centre has successfully conducted the course work for the scholars.

Research Cell

Research Cell of the college has taken the initiative to promote research among faculty and students. To encourage research, 'Seed Money' is provided both to the faculty and students. During the academic year 2019-20, our faculty members have published more than 50 Research Papers and participated in more than 200 Workshops/Webinars/FDPs/Conferences.

Student Research Forum has encouraged students to develop research bent of mind and scientific temper to involve in research activities. Students are encouraged and guided to actively participate and present research papers in 'Avishkar', a State level Research Convention in our college.

On 14th May, 2019 the IQAC of the college in association with Research Cell organised a National Level Webinar on 'Doctoral Thesis: Key Components and Research Skills' & 'Research Funding Opportunities: In India and Abroad' from through Zoom app, which was also available on YouTube simultaneously.

To promote research among students, different departments have taken initiative to bring out Departmental Magazines such as B.Com. Programme - Vanijyam, BAF & BBI Programme - ArthLekh, Economics Department - The Spectator, BMS Department - Magnates, BMM Department- Saamvarta B.Sc.(IGT) Department - Digital Minds and by Research Cell - Anveshan.

## Certificate Courses

To enrich the curriculum and to enhance employability of our students, short term certificate courses such as Microsoft Certification on Advanced Excel and Ethical Hacking, Financial Markets, International Software Testing Quality Board Certificate, Digital Marketing, Tally ERP 9 and GST and Incubation Centre for Entrepreneurship Development are being conducted in the college.

## Faculty Contribution

Faculty has contributed substantially in the syllabus revision exercise and question paper setting of T.Y. programmes of University of Mumbai. The areas included Economics, Mass Media, Management Studies, Accountancy and Information Technology. A few faculty members have authored books in their domain



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areas. The faculty has been invited as Resource person also at various prestigious colleges across the nation.

## Students' Council

The Students' Council Oath Taking Ceremony was conducted on 15th February, 2020 where the newly selected members of the core committee were officially vested with their powers and positions. Ms. Divya Shaj of SYBMM was selected as the General Secretary of Students' Council for the academic year 2019-2020 with 14 core committee members. Students' Council has organized events like Kaavish-An Intercollegiate Event with four competitions i.e. Poster Making, Power Point Presentation, Best out of Waste, Handwriting competition. Visit to Orphanage House at J.B.Nagar Chakala, Mumbai as part of community service, Avabodha session to develop leadership qualities, a Mumbai Police initiative 'Jagrut Mumbaikar'- Citizen's Awareness Program was organized on 23rd August, 2019.

**Extension Services** - National Service Scheme (N.S.S.), Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE) and Women Development Cell (WDC)

Currently two units of NSS are functioning with 150 Volunteers. The NSS units of the college had organized blood donation camp and collected more than 200 units of blood. The NSS unit of Bunts Sangha's S.M. 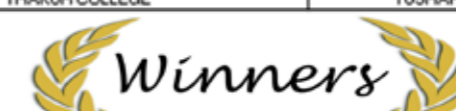

## • Kaarva- BMM Department Fest

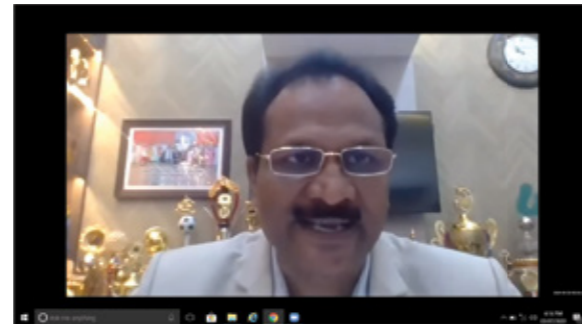

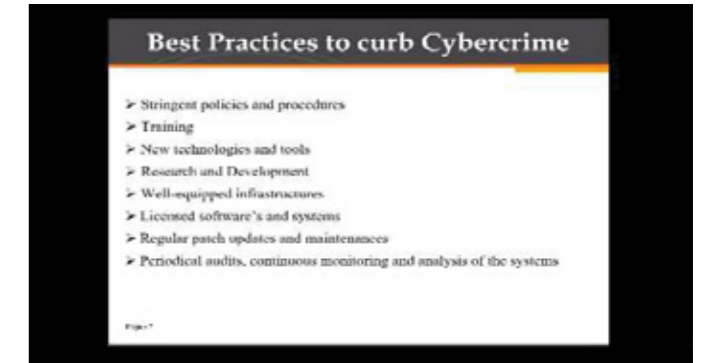

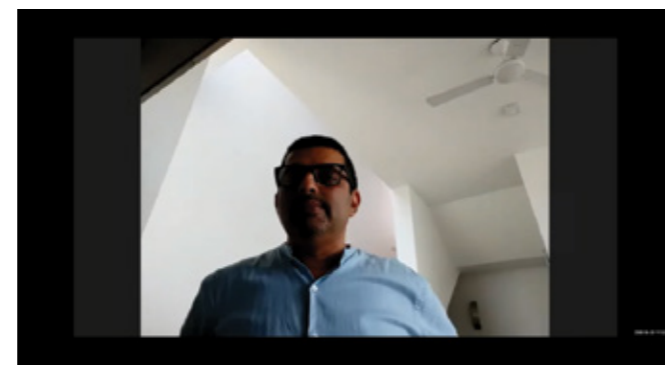

Many activities were conducted by DLLE throughout the



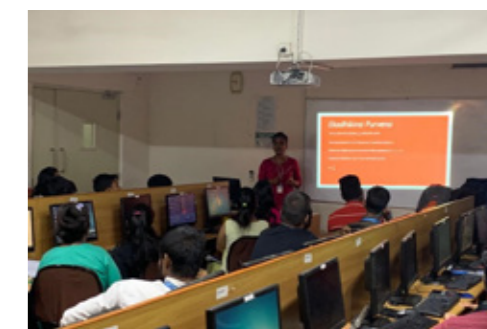

Online catalogue of the library, 'SOUL Web OPAC' enables users to search for resources available in the library. To keep the teaching fraternity abreast with the latest developments in their field, the library provides contents page service of current periodicals on a regular basis. Digital Repository created by the library offers access to past years question papers & other online resources. To inculcate good reading habits amongst the students, various events like Book Review Competitions, Book Displays, Book Exhibition etc. are arranged by the library. The library conducts orientation programmes & library awareness programmes on a regular basis. Apart from this the library provides a variety of services to its users. ### Library Book Exhibition

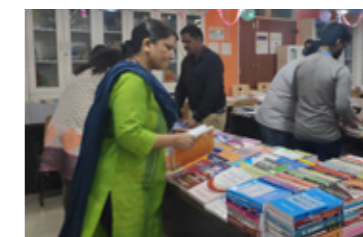

## LOCKDOWN DIARIES 2019

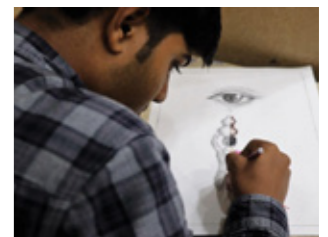

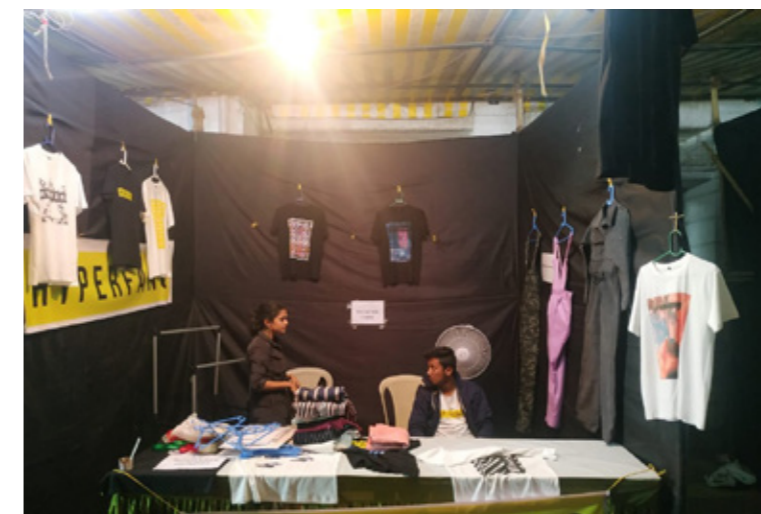
# INCUBATION CENTRE

The Incubation Centre of Bunts Sangha’s S.M. Shetty College of Science, Commerce and Management Studies is established for the purpose of encouraging students to consider starting their own enterprise as one of the career options. The centre organizes guidance and training session so that students can envision the process of enterprise development. The centre does not only guide the students but also help in developing skills which may help them to run their business efficiently. In the academic year 2019-20, the centre started with collecting information about the students who are having their own businesses or who want to start their own venture in future. The information was also collected related to what type of guidance or support would they like to have from the centre. The first session conducted by the centre was an interactive session with Mr. Akshay Dhamal – My Business My Idea. Mr. Akshay Dhamal is an inspirational speaker, resource person for incubation centres and an entrepreneur. He is also an alumnus of the college. During the session the students had an open discussion about their problems and apprehensions related to their own businesses. To encourage out-of-the-box thinking the centre organized poster making competition – Solutions to Urban Problems. The posters were judged by Dr. Liji Santosh and Ms. Niveditha Shetty. 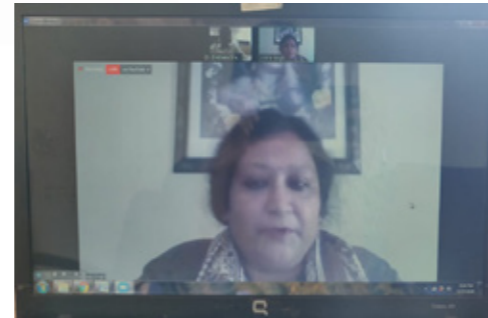
## INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

### Marketing Post Pandemic

In the aftermath of the 9/11 attacks, there is documented evidence of Americans' desire to 'seize the day' by engaging in excessive consumption. This overconsumption took the form of buying expensive, luxury products as well as bargain shopping, stocking up on goods, and overconsuming sweets(1).

Mortality Salience is the awareness by individuals that their death is inevitable. The term derives from Terror Management Theory which proposes that mortality salience causes existential anxiety that influences our attitudes and behavior.

We become more of what we are

Empirical evidence has shown that when reminded of their mortality, individuals are more likely to validate their specific cultural world views(2). For example, if a person was competitive about material growth it would make them more so. If someone wasn't environmentally conscious very deeply, to begin with, there are more chances that they will not bat an eyelid about contributing to pollution or about forest land being cleared for construction. Mortality salience makes individuals motivated to distinguish themselves from the rest of nature to facilitate their denial of being just another creature that can perish without a big deal. They are more likely to disconnect themselves from other animals and treat animals as resources, commodities, and goods whose purpose is to benefit human beings(3). What this shows is that if like most of us your dominating world view was materialism at the cost of everything else, congratulations, you will be more so now.

Overconsumption (or I want to spend all my ka-ching)

Materialism is defined as a belief that the acquisition of material possessions (which

are often status laden) will make one happy. Mortality Salience triggers increased spend on pleasurable and luxury items. By focusing on the immediate sensations resulting from disinhibited consumption, people are able to avoid confronting their existential anxieties (4). Excessive consumption, as a means of escape from self-awareness, might take the form of either overeating or excessive shopping (or both). An individual's self-esteem may be threatened by thoughts of mortality if the individual fears dying without leaving a significant mark on the universe. One well-established strategy to try to counteract or buffer such fear is bolstering one's self-esteem and the easiest way to do this for most people is to splurge on luxury status symbols. And the other big esteem booster of our times - Fitness, is about to become even bigger than before. Brands that address these two segments better be ready.

Intergenerational Altruism (or remember me, baby)

A lot more money will be utilised by the rich to set up grants, funds, and memorials in addition to creating legacies for their own offspring. The reason behind this rationale is that intergenerational altruism extends individuals' existence into the future and helps them to achieve the goal of symbolic immortality by facilitating a psychological connection between the self and others in the future(5).

While this topic is a part of various in-depth studies by psychologists, for us here, the key takeaway would be:

Consumerism, materialism, and money spending will increase in the near future, which is clearly good news for marketers. Communication specialists should evaluate their brand's positioning, and calibrate their messaging to address changes in the consumer psyche brought about by this pandemic. Don't lose the opportunity to get your share of the consumer's wallet!

As the world is entering the era of big data, the need for storage has also grown. Now that frameworks like Hadoop have successfully solved the problem of storage, the main focus now is the processing of the data collected.

Data Science is a blend of tools, algorithms and machine learning principles which is used to discover hidden patterns from the raw data. A data analyst explains what is going on by processing the historical data. A data scientist does exploratory analysis to discover insights from data; he/she may also use advanced ML algorithms to identify the occurrence of particular event in future. Data Science is primarily used to make decisions and predictions using predictive causal analytics, prescriptive analytics and machine learning.

Often data science is confused with BI. Traditionally, the data stored was structured and small in size, which could be analyzed by simple BI tools. Today most of the data is unstructured or semi-structured. The data being generated nowadays are from different sources like financial logs, text files, multimedia forms, sensors and instruments. Simple BI tools are not capable of processing this huge volume and variety of data. Hence we need more complex and advanced analytical tools and algorithms for processing, analyzing and drawing meaningful insights from it.

BI analyzes previous data to find hindsight and insight to describe business trends. BI enables you to take data from external and internal sources, prepare it, run queries on it and create dashboards to answer the questions like quarterly revenue analysis or business problems. BI can evaluate the impact of certain events in the near future. Data Science is a more forward-looking approach. It is an exploratory way with the focus

on analyzing past or current data and predicting the future outcomes with the aim of making informed decisions.

The term "Data Scientist" has been coined after considering the fact that a Data Scientist draws a lot of information from the scientific fields and applications whether it is statistics or mathematics. They make a lot of use of the latest technologies in finding solutions and reaching conclusions that are crucial for an organization's growth and development. Data Scientists present the data in a much more useful form as compared to the raw data available to them from structured as well as unstructured forms.

Just like any other scientific discipline, data scientists always need to ask and find answers of What, How, Who and Why of the data available to them. They are required to make a clear defined plan and work towards achieving the results within limited time, effort and money.

Data scientists are very curious, who love a large amount of data, and more than that, they love to play with such huge data to reach important inferences and spot trends. This is what distinguishes a Data Scientist from a traditional Data Analyst. A Data scientist not only refers one particular source such as a social media site or a log file but various other sources with the aim to find out a hidden insight that can prove to be very significant for the organization.

As Data Science is an emerging field, there is a plethora of opportunities available world across. Going through any of the job portals; you will be taken aback by the number of job openings available for Data scientists in different industries, whether it is IT or healthcare, retail or Government offices or academics, life sciences, oceanography, etc.

## TECHNOLOGY AND BANKING DELIVERY CHANNELS

Technology has touched every aspect of our lives in the recent years and banking has been no exception. The deployment of technology has also changed the channels via which customers interact with their banks. In this article, we will trace these changing channels of banking service delivery.

### Traditional Delivery Format: Bank Branches

Mechanisms have been created in order to ensure this. Such mechanisms include phone banking passwords and confirmation of personal information that can only be provided by the account holder.

Phone banking provides customers with extreme convenience as they can avail the service 24 by 7 and from any geographical location. Also, phone banking allows banks to reduce costs as they can outsource their call centers to lower cost countries like India where the work can be done at a fraction of the cost. Hence, a win-win situation is created.

### Internet:

Internet banking is the provisioning of banking services over the web. Like phone banking, internet banking can be used to replicate all the services that are offered in brick and mortar branches. Also, like phone banking, identification of customers is a problem. Internet banking faces its unique sets of risks like phishing attacks and hacking of customer accounts. However, the development in technology has allowed the banks to build secure systems which can defend against such attacks.

The main reason behind the massive thrust on internet banking is that the processing capability gets transferred from bank staff to users. Hence, if a user needs a bank statement, they can obtain it themselves. The requirement of bank staff is completely eliminated and this helps the bank save massive costs. It is for this reason that banks insist on educating customers about internet banking and prefer to deal with customers in that manner.

### Smartphone:

Developments in information technology have made it possible for people to conduct banking transactions while on the go. The cell phones of people are connected with high speed internet. Also, mobile applications have been developed which enable customers to obtain all the services that they would be able to avail at a branch. Once again, the threats of security attacks and hacking are present. However, these are risks that are being mitigated.

The banking industry believes that mobile banking or m-banking is the future of the industry wherein people will be able to avail any service they require at the click of a few buttons. Technology is therefore enabling banks to provide customers with unprecedented service levels while simultaneously providing their shareholders with unprecedented return on equity.

Technological developments in computing are certain to find more applications in the banking world. Therefore, the forerunners in the banking industry understand that their business has become intertwined with technology and the next industry leader will be someone who is able to utilize technology to the maximum.

They majorly learned with the help of chalk-duster method in a physical classroom setting. Teaching and learning was basically one way with teachers lecturing to students in the classroom. At that period, radio and television were the primary sources of information and communication in India. Then education in India took one step ahead with the addition of Generation X. Gen X students also learned in ICT deprived classrooms; but with a slight improvement of white boards in the classroom, and colored television as learning and information sources. At this time the developed countries in the world were busy in transforming the face of ICT. However India was able to reap the benefits of this ICT revolution after the advent of Generation Y or Millennials. Millennials got to experience technology in their coming of age years. Introduction of cell phone, computer/laptops, video, mp3 players and internet reformed the way in which information was exchanged and learning took place. Millennials basically grew up with technology all around them. Information was available easily through the internet and television. The kind of serials/channels they have seen on television while growing up provided them with superlative audio-visual and mental stimulation. They became more receptive and habitual to technologically advanced tools of learning. Now the most innovative tools are being used nowadays to teach the latest generation Z. Generation Z members are practically born with technology (cell phones) in their hands and they cannot learn or live without it. Early introduction to ICT tools have made them digital natives and has increased their need to be engaged continuously (with ICT) while learning.

Hence in order to make education more interesting for today's learners, it has become imperative for the teachers to adapt themselves to innovative and technologically advanced tools of teaching. Instead of using only black boards, use of projectors & PPTs, use of audios, videos, Google classrooms etc has become the norm of the day. Instructing them to deliver powerpoint presentations, mailing them assignments, online tests or online competitive examinations etc are some of the methods to prepare them for a more technologically savvy work environment.

In present time imparting education is no more a one way road. As we are embracing the concept of flipped classrooms, now the students are called learners and teachers have become facilitators. Knowledge flows in from both the directions. As information is readily available anywhere and everywhere, the education system in India might transform completely. Along with the learners, even teachers are all the more engaged in learning and mastering ICT tools.

It's a fact that ICT is here to change the face of Indian education; however it can never eliminate the role of a teacher in student's life. The sheer joy of learning and teaching can be derived more from face to face interaction in a physical classroom setting. It is also true that the benefit of technology comes at a price (which rural India cannot afford completely) and some unavoidable technical glitches as well. Low bandwidth problems and low internet penetration in rural areas can widen the existing gap in the educational and learning facilities available to learners living in rural areas. It might also create two types of workforce: one from urban areas; which is tech-savvy & tech-dependent; and the other one from rural areas; which is tech-deprived but equally competent.

Thus to achieve the vision of inclusive growth (in every perspective), I strongly believe that ICT will play an essential role in bridging the existing gap between: rural & urban India, learners & teachers and previous & present generations.

### My Coronavirus Recovery Tale

On 7th of May 2020, I underwent testing for COVID-19 at a BMC testing camp near my residence. I got myself tested as I had spent a considerable amount of time on field reporting on Coronavirus developments in nearby slum establishments along with assisting NGOs in the distribution of essentials to daily wage workers, and the families of those struggling to make ends meet.

Panic set in the moment I had gotten myself tested. Suddenly, the grim reality of contacting the virus hit me. Until then, being personally affected by the virus felt like an abstract concept. I had taken all the necessary precautions during my journalism assignments. I kept soothing and reassuring myself with the thought, "I am young and that I will not contract the virus". However, despite my best efforts at trying to put up a brave face, I was scared. The anxiety of not knowing my fate was killing me.

Was going out on assignments worth it? Is my work even appreciated? We reporters are the subject to critique and snide remarks, did I really have any obligations towards the truth? These were uncomfortable questions which crawled their way into my headspace. I spent the next day battling thoughts of my uncertain days to come and as destiny would have it...my tests came back positive.

After I received 'the call' from the BMC official confirming my ordeal, I was oddly put to ease. At least now I finally knew what was going on. My family, on the other hand, broke down in tears and were inconsolable. Looking at their despair, I tried my best to lift their spirits, without breaking down myself. I remember the last meal I had at home before leaving; its memory helped me brave through everything that was set to come my way.

I was taken to the Karve Nagar (Kanjurmarg East) quarantine facility in an ambulance. I wasn't very hopeful at the start but then things took a positive turn with the passage of time. Everyone at the facility—doctors, nurses, helpers, patients—were scared. There is this sense of uncertainty that loomed and it was killing us all from within. The first couple of days were very rough, but then we found the key to beating the virus—relationships. In the centre, I befriended other COVID patients and we walked shoulder to shoulder out of the battlefield.

A handful of the staff went an extra mile towards making the lives of the patients a little more bearable. This kept our morale high and gave us a sliver of joy in our lives' worst moments. The doctor who was assigned to our facility in the latter half of my stay there, used to bring things to eat for patients as the food at the facility was almost always inadequate, undercooked, and never arrived on time. On some days, we were also graced by insects in our food.

Overworked departments coupled with bureaucratic bottlenecks created delays in testing as well as the delivery of results. Countless patients had to stay in the facility long after their recovery because of the sluggish operations. I for one had to fight my way to get my reports back from the testing centre. And after 13 days of staying at the quarantine facility...I beat it. I beat the virus! I was allowed to go back home to my loving family. And all I can say is I'm a 'new Gaurav Sharma' in this 'new normal'.

And I know that we are all going to beat this virus and then years from now it'll just be folklore, because the real vaccine is what we all have within us — humanity.

किसी भी समाज में युवाओं की भूमिका सर्वाधिक है। महान चीजें युवा लोगों के हाथों में होती हैं। युवा कल के समाज की आशा हैं। एक पुराने समाज के अवशेष हो सकते हैं। लेकिन युवा हमारे समाज के वर्तमान और भविष्य के निर्माता हैं। तेरह से उन्नीस वर्ष तक की अवस्था को युवावस्था कहा जाता है। आज के युवक-युवति एक चौराहे पर खड़े हैं और संभ्रमित अवस्था में हैं। युवक में भरपूर उत्साह और ऊर्जा होती है किंतु सही दिशा में नहीं लगाते। वे राष्ट्र का भविष्य होते हैं। किंतु अपने ही बनाए नियमों और मूल्यों की दुनिया में रहना चाहते हैं। युवक अपना दिनचर्या का अधिकांश समय टी.वी. के सामने और मोबाइल में खेल खेलने में व्यतीत करते हैं। वे अपना स्वतंत्र व्यक्तित्व बनाना और जिंदगी में अधिक मजे लूटना चाहते हैं। उन्हें लगता है कि जिंदगी सिर्फ मौज-मजे के लिए है और उन पर कोई पाबंदी न हो।

आज-कल पयविरण सुरक्षा एरां संबंधन के बारे में बहुत कुछ कहा-सुना जाता है। चर्चा, कांफ्रेंस, समचार-पत्रों या मैगजिन में छपनेवाले लेख आदि यह सबसे ताजा विषय है। प्रति वर्ष १५ जून को विश्व पयविरण दिवस तथा २२ अप्रैल को पृथ्वी दिवस मनाया जाता है। यह एक अच्छी प्रथा है। क्योंकि इससे युवों के बीच पयविरण के प्रति बढ़ती हुई जागरूकता एवं रुचि व्यक्त होती है। तथापि 'पयविरण' इस शब्द का वास्तव में अर्थ क्या है? हमारा पयविरण किन घटकों से बना है? यह एक मूल प्रश्न है जिसके बारे में युवक संदिग्ध और संभ्रमित रहते हैं। शब्दानुसार 'पयविरण' का अर्थ है हमारे आसपास का वातावरण। इसमें युवक पर परिणाम करनेवाली सभी अवस्थाओं, परिस्थितियों, परिणामों, घटनाओं आदि का समावेश होता है। युवा और पयविरण एक ही सिक्के के दो पहलू हैं। अगर हमारे युवक पयविरण के घटकों का आवश्यक प्रमाण न रखें तो हमारी पृथ्वी भी मंगल एरां बुध ग्रह की ही तरह एक मृतप्राय तथा निष्क्रिय ग्रह होता। किन्तु आज हमारा पयविरण संकटग्रस्त है, तेजी से बटनेवाले प्रदूषण के कारण इसी भयानक परिस्थिति के कारण अनेक प्रकार के पक्षी, वनस्पति एरां कीटक नष्ट हो चुके हैं या हो रहे हैं। आजकल के युवा का पयविरण में कोई दिलचस्पी नहीं रही है। उन्हें बस औद्योगिकीकरण में दिलचस्पी है। वह बस खुद को आगे बढ़ाना चाहते हैं। वह प्राकृतिक स्रोतों का बिना सोचे समझे किया जानेवाला अतिरिक्त इस्तेमाल, अविवेकी एरां अत्याधिक रूप से किया जानेवाला औद्योगिक तेजी से बटनेवाली आबादी, इनके कारण यह समस्या अधिक पेंचिली हो गई है।

आज हम कोई भी युवक से पूछें उन्हें क्या बनना है? तो कोई भी यह नहीं बोलता हमें किसान बनना है। क्योंकि आज किसान के सिवा किस को भी पयविरण का महत्व नहीं रहा है। अगर आजकल के युवक पयविरण स्वच्छ रखने के लिये कुछ कर नहीं सकते तो पयविरण खराब भी ना करें। वह अपनी जिंदगी अरामदायक बनाने के लिये प्रगतिक के नाम से जंगल तोड़ रहे हैं। और उस जगह कंक्रीट के इमारतों का जंगल बना रहे हैं। और मोबाइल में नेटवर्क के लिये मोबाइल टावर बना रहे हैं। और यह टॉवर उच्च विकिरण परिहारन पयविरण में छोड़ते हैं। इस कारण दिन प्रति दिन पयविरण में से कई पक्षी मर रहे हैं। आजकल के युवान को फिल्म देखना बहुत पसन्द है। मगर आजतक किसी ने भी पयविरण संरक्षण प्रति एक भी फिल्म नहीं बनायी है। हर फिल्म का एक मशहूर लाइन होती है। जैसे सलमान खान जी का एक वातलाप है। 'शुक्रिया मत कहो तिन लोग की मदद करे और उन तिन को कहे वह और तिन की मदद करे'। मगर मुझे लगता है की यहा ये वातलाप होता तो अच्छा

होता 'आप एक पेड़ लगाये और उसका अच्छे से देखभाल करे'। वह यह भूल गये हैं की हमारे क्रांतिकारी भी जब शहीद हुवा अपने देश को आझाद करने के लिये वह भी युवा थे। और आज के युवक आझादी का गलत फायदा उठा रहे हैं।

पृथ्वी के पयविरण प अनेक गलत मानवी क्रिया-कलापों का गहरा असर हो रहा है। इनमें से एक है फील, पेट्रोल, डीजल, केरोसीन, नैचुरल गैस जैसे भूगर्भ में स्थित इंधनों का अविवेकी इस्तेमाल हमारे युवक करे हैं। इस से विश्व का तापमान भी बढ़ता है एरां वे पयविरण में अधिक एनर्जी छोड़ते हैं जिसके कारण विनाशकारी तूफान, साइक्लोनस्, टायफून्स, चक्रवात, आदि आते हैं। अनावश्यक मानवी क्रिया-कलापों के कारण पयविरण में छोड़े जानेवाले हरित गैस मौसम को बदल देते हैं। इससे वनों में बड़ी मात्रा में आगा लग जाती है जैसा कि हाल ही में ऑस्ट्रेलिया, इंडोनेशिया, अमेजन एरां उसके आसपास के द्वीप-समूहों में हुआ था।

वन तथा हरित क्षेत्र हमारे पयविरण का अटूट अंग है। किन्तु अब वन तेजी से नष्ट हो रहे हैं। और युवा उस बात को अनदेखा कर रहे हैं।

एक समय ऐसा था जब पृथ्वी के कुल क्षेत्रफल में से ४० प्रतिशत हिस्सा वनों से आच्छादित था। लेकिन औद्योगिकीकरण के लिये जंगल काट कर कंक्रीट के इमारतों का जंगल बना दिया है। युसी वजह से वही क्षेत्र अब घटकर २५ प्रतिशत ही रह गया है। वनों तथा पयविरण का यह नाश, जो कि युवक की प्राकृतिक स्रोतों को पाने की अति लालसा एवं अविवेकी उपभोग के कारण हो रहा है, एक शोकान्त घटना है। पयविरण की सुरक्षा अत्याधिक महत्वपूर्ण है।

उन्हें हर कीमत पर बचाना चाहिए पयविरण का प्रदूषण युवक के सामने खड़ा हुआ एक बहुत बड़ा संकट है। छोटे बच्चों को 'ईवीएस' विषय रखने से अच्छा हमारे युवक को सीखाना चाहिये क्योंकि बच्चें अपने बड़ों से ही सीखते हैं। मतलब युवक से। अगर युवक ही पयविरण का ख्याल नहीं रखेंगे तो बच्चे भी नहीं रखेंगे। अगर हमारे पूर्वज पयविरण को ही अपना देवता मानते थे। तो हम क्यू नहीं मानते अगर हमारे पूर्वज ने पयविरण का ख्याल नहीं रखा होता तो क्या आज हम शांति से इस पयविरण में रहे पाते। पूरे सौर मंडल में पृथ्वी ही ऐसा एक मात्र ग्रह है जिस पर पयविरण है। अब यह हम पर मतलब हमारे युवक पर है इसे संतुलित रखे।

अब वह समय आ गया है जब युवक को यह सीखना चाहिए कि पयविरण पर विजय पाने के बजाय उसके साथ मिल-जुलकर रहना एवं मित्रता पूर्णता: पयविरण पर निर्भर है। युवक पयविरण का एक महत्वपूर्ण हिस्सा है तथा उसे पयविरण के संतुलन को बिगाड़ने का प्रयास भी नहीं करना चाहिए। प्रकृति और पयविरण के बीच का यह संतुलन जीवन का आधार है। पयविरण जीवन के लिए आवश्यक घटक जैसे हवा, पानी, अनाज, तापमान, अवास, आदि उपलब्ध कराहा है। जीवसृष्टि एवं उसके आस-पास की परिस्थिति विभिन्न पयविरण घटकों का एक सही संतुलन है एवं उसे हर कीमत पर बचाकर रखना चाहिए। इस नाजुक एवं मृदु जीवसृष्टि को कदापि धक्का नहीं पहुँचना चाहिए। हमारे जीवन एवं प्रगति के लिए यह आत्यावश्यक है कि हम पयविरण के नियमों का पालन करें एवं उसके साथ मित्रता पूर्ण, स्नेह का व्यवहार करें।

## एका थोर शिक्षिकाची गोष्ट - सावित्रीबाई फुले

सावित्रीबाई जोतीराव फुले यांचा जन्म ३ जानेवारी १९३१ मध्ये झाला. या भारताच्या पहिल्या शिक्षिका आणि मुख्यध्यापिका होत्या त्या कवियत्री सुध्दा होत्या त्या एक समाज सुधारक होत्या स्त्रीयांना पुढे घेऊन येणाऱ्या सावित्रीबाई फुले या पहिल्या स्त्री होत्या. सावित्रीबाई यांचे पती जोतीराव फुले हे सुध्दा शिक्षक होते गरिब व गरजू मुलांना मोफत शाळा शिकवत असे. त्या काळात मुलींना त्यांच्या घरचे शिकवत नसे. त्यामुळे जोतीराव फुले यांनी स्वतःच्या घरापासून सुरुवात केली आणि अगोदर त्यांनी आपल्या पत्नीला सावित्रीबाई फुले यांना लिहिल्या आणि वाचायला शिकवले आणि मग पुण्यात त्यांनी मुलींची पहिली शाळा सुरु केली.

त्या काळात मुलींना फक्त मुल आणि चुल हेच माहित होते. पण ते सावित्रीबाईंनी ते मोडून काढला त्यांना मुलींना शिकवण्यासाठी लोकांचा रोष पत्कारला लोकांनी त्यांच्यावर शोणांचा गोब्याचा मारा केला. तरी सुध्दा सावित्रीबाई या हारल्या नाहीत त्यांनी त्याच काम हे चालूच ठेवले. त्यांनी गरीब मुलींना अनेक मदत केली. त्या काळात असप्रुश्य मुला - मुलींना शिकवण्यासाठी बंदी होती पण जोतीराव फुले हे त्या मुलांसाठी काम करण्याचे ठरवले होते. असप्रुश्य निर्मलनासाठी जोतीरावांचा हा महत्वाचा वाटा होता. त्या काळात सावित्रींनी स्त्रीयांमध्ये जन-जागृती करण्याचा वसा घेतला होता.

जोतीरावांनी मुलींसाठी एक म्हण तयार केली मुलगी शिकली प्रगती झाली ज्या म्हणीवर आज स्त्रीया दुसऱ्या देशात सुध्दा जावून शिकत आहे. ज्या म्हणीमुळे आज प्रत्येक मुलगी आपल्या पायावर उभी आहे. मला याचा अभिमान आहे.

सावित्रीबाई दिन-दलित मुली आणि स्त्रीयांची अस्वस्थ करीत असे मग सावित्रीबाईंनी स्त्रीयांना वाचायला लिहिल्या शिकवून त्या कवियत्री झाल्या त्या आपल्या कवितेतून त्या स्त्रियांमध्ये जन-जागृती करू लागल्या. सावित्रीबाई या अनेका गावा-गावात जावून स्त्रियांना आणि मुलींना शिक्षणाची गोडी लावू लागल्या त्या गरजू मुलींसाठी शाळेचे कपडे घेत असत त्यांना खाऊ देऊन प्रेमाने अक्षरांची ओळख करून देत त्या छान-छान कविता तयार करून त्या मुलींना गावून दाखवायच्या अशा प्रकारे ते मुलींना पुढे घेऊन जात होते. जोतीराव फुलेंचे स्वप्न हे खर होत जात होत.

सावित्रीबाई फुले यांचा देशाच्या स्वतंत्र्यात त्यांचा महत्त्वाचा वाटा आहे. सावित्रीबाईंनी जोतीरावांसोबत संसाराची पन्नास वर्षे काढली आणि त्या पन्नास वर्षात त्यांनी त्या देशांचे हित जपले हे आपले सगळ्यांना ठावूक आहे.

१८५४ मध्ये सावित्रीबाईंचा 'काव्यफुले' हा पहिला कवितासंग्रह प्रसिध्द झाला पिवळा चाफा, चाईचे फुल, जाईची कळी, गुलाब फुल हे त्यांच्या कविता आजही आपण शाळेत शिकत आहोत. त्यांच्या प्रत्येक गोष्टी आपल्याला आजही शिकवून देत आहे. ऐका पुरुषाच्या पाठिशी एक स्त्रि असते हे खर आहे. सावित्रीबाईंनी समाजात प्रगती घडवण्यासाठी जोतीरावांना मोलाची साथ दिली आणि ते आपल्या भारत देशासाठी एक मिशाल आहेत. जर आज आपल्या समाजात जोतीराव आणि सावित्रीबाई सारखी थोर माणसे असतील तर समाजात कोणत्याच मुलींना कोणवरच अवलंबून राहता येणार नाही. मी दोन ओळी त्यांच्यासाठी लिहित आहे.

तुम्ही मिशाल आहात प्रत्येक स्त्रिची ।। परत जन्म घ्या या पृथ्वीवरी ।।

कारण गरज आहे तुमची या गरिब मुलींना ।। तुमची शिकवण आम्ही पुढे घेऊन जावू ।।

आपण हे अगदी चांगल्या प्रकारे समजून घेतले पाहिजे की केवळ आपले घर स्वच्छ ठेवून आपण निरोगी व्हाल ? आपल्या सभोवतालचा कचरा साफ करणे ही आपली जबाबदारी आहे. सुरक्षित वगाला या गोष्टी समाजतात पण त्या पाळल्या पाहिजेत. अशिक्षित वगाला घाण पसरणा या आजारांविषयी माहिती दिली पाहिजे, त्यांना स्वच्छतेबद्दल जागरूक करणे आपले परम कर्तव्य आहे. आपल्याला वेगवेगळ्या सुविधा उपलब्ध आहे जसे संत गाडेबाबा शतामस्वच्छता व बरेच देशातील सर्व शहरांमधील व गांवांमधील नागरिकांना स्वच्छ पयविरण व चांगले आरोग्य मिळावे यासाठी केंद्र शासनाने स्वच्छ भारत अभियान संपूर्ण देशामध्ये राबविणे सुरु केले आहे.

## Second Phase of SM Shetty Rd Repair Begins; Multiple Traffic Diversions

The first phase had been completed before monsoon this year where a fresh concrete road was constructed. The second and remaining phase of the work has been entrusted to the Navdeep Construction Company, with the entire process to be completed within 20-25 days, and the road will also be completely closed for traffic for the same amount of time.

Powaiites will have to brace themselves for a severe inconvenience owing to the closure of the road opposite the SM Shetty School and College, which is now undergoing the next phase of road construction. Dr Sridhara Shetty, the Principle of SM Shetty College and Secretary of Staff, Indian Institute of Technology (IIT)-Bombay have been notified by an Assistant engineer of the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai's S Ward. The first phase had been completed before monsoon this year where a fresh concrete road was constructed.

The road improvement work has been entrusted to the Navdeep Construction Company, with the entire process to be completed

within 20-25 days, and the road will also be completely closed for traffic for the same amount of time. "The necessary traffic permission to carry out the work of said road is received from the traffic department. It is requested to use alternative route for traffic movement," said the letter.

Going via the Shiv Bhagtani housing societies,
