Academic year 2021-2022 witnessed partially online mode of teaching and partially hybrid mode of teaching. The academic year did not support the all-round development of students due to the pandemic and its inherent risk. As a result students lost learnability which is the core of academics and sociability which is the central part of personality development. Despite this, college has taken necessary measures to keep the students updated and well informed.

Permanent Affiliation, one of the most sought-after requirements of the college was granted by University of Mumbai in 2021. Also we got the approval to commence post-graduation programme in M.Com in Business Management. We are going for the 2nd cycle of NAAC accreditation in the academic year 2022-2023. The college is slowly gearing up to know the intricacies of NEP 2020 and the challenges we need to overcome for its implementation. Meeting the structural changes and developing a multi-disciplinary institution is really an uphill task.

The pandemic thrust on us new challenges of teaching and learning. During the academic year 2021-2022, 1155 subject related videos have been uploaded for the benefit of the students. In 2021-2022 the college has got the much awaited Permanent Affiliation from University of Mumbai.

Students, Programmes and Faculty

The college currently offers undergraduate programmes in B.Com, B.Com. (Banking & Insurance), B.Com. (Accounting & Finance), BMS, B.Sc. (IT), BAMMC and post-graduation programmes in M.Com. (Advanced Accountancy), M.Com. (Business Management), M.Sc. (IT) and Ph.D. programme in Commerce. The total strength of the college stood at 2553 which is an all-time high number. All programmes are filled to the sanctioned capacity of University of Mumbai. Currently, there are in all 35 full time Assistant Professors, 18 visiting faculty and 14 non-teaching staff including 6 general administrative Staff on the roll. The college has appointed a full time Physical director and also a full time counsellor for the benefit of students.

Results

Due to the prevailing pandemic situations, University of Mumbai has decided to go ahead with both online and offline examinations. The college has deployed Eklavya Software with features like Proctoring and shuffling questions so as to conduct Examinations in a disciplined way. During the academic year 2020-21, University of Mumbai entrusted us with more responsibilities to lead the cluster colleges.

'Research Methodology Workshops in Social Sciences' for 10 days by obtaining research funding from Western Region Centre (WRC) and Indian Institute of Social Sciences (ICSSR), initiative to conduct 24 certificate courses from different domain areas including cross cutting issues, induction programme for the faculty, training on Outcome Based Education (OBE), workshop on Emerging Learning Design for Engaging Classroom in Higher Education, Webinar on Nutrition Phonics: a road map for disease free life, National Level Webinar on ITR Filing, Video Making for Skill Enhancement of Online Teaching, Super Brain Power Asana, 2 Days Training Session for NAAC Preparations, Inclusive Education: LGBTQ perspective, Session on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), Orientation on National Education Policy 2020, Workshop on UGC NET\SET Training, undertaken various audits like administrative audit, academic audit, library audit, green audit, energy audit and environment audit, initiative to get affiliation for B.Sc- Data Science from the academic year 2022-2023, participation in NIRF, ISO 21001:2018, new feedback structure for teaching learning evaluation, green initiatives like completion of rain water harvesting and installation of solar panels, installation of institutional repository, 'D-Space' and initiative for new website.

Certificate Courses

To enrich the curriculum and to enhance employability of our students, short term certificate courses such as Mutual Fund Distributors by NISM, Digital Marketing & E – CRM, Research Methodology, Tally ERP 9 and GST, Equity and Advanced Equity Research, Networking and G-Suite Fundamentals, Financial Plan Construction, Financial Markets, Microsoft, Human Resource Management(HRM), Direct Tax, Film Making, Graphic Design, Microsoft CPM, Advance Python, Ruby on Rail, Office Automation, Basics of Guitar, Basics of Marathi, Basics of Kannada Language and Behavioral Economics, In all, 24 such Certificate Courses were conducted in line with NAAC guidelines.

Promotion of Research Culture in the Campus

Research Centre in Commerce

University of Mumbai has approved our Ph.D. centre in the faculty of Commerce and in the subject 'Business Policy and Administration' leading to Ph.D. degree from October 2017 onwards. During the academic year 2021-2022 three more Ph.D scholars were selected and thus making the total research scholars eight in number pursuing their Doctoral Programme from our research centre. Principal, Dr. Sridhara Shetty is guiding the research scholars. The centre has successfully conducted the course work for the scholars. Research Cell

The Research Cell of the college has taken the initiative to promote research among faculty and students. To encourage Research, 'Seed Money' is provided both to the faculty and students. During the academic year 2021-22, our faculty members have published 16 books and chapters and 35 Research papers. During the academic year 2021-2022 Rs. 37,850/- and 12,800/- was distributed as seed money to teachers and students

respectively.

The Student Research Forum has encouraged students to develop a research bent of mind and scientific temper to be involved in research activities. Students are encouraged and guided to actively participate and present research papers in 'Avishkar', a State level Research Convention. During the Avishkar of 2021-22, 47 research projects have been presented and 3 projects have secured the winning places.

Department of Accountancy & Financial Management organised a National Level Multidisciplinary E-Conference on 'Pandemic Induced Creative Disruptions: Issues, Challenges and Prospects' on 30th September,

2021. In all, 411 participants attended.

The Department of Commerce and Allied Subjects in Collaboration with NSS Unit Organized Multidisciplinary National Level Student Research E - Conference on 'Economic, Ecological and Entrepreneurial Innovations and Development in Post Pandemic Era: Issues, Challenges & Prospects' on 31st January, 2022.

A National Conference was organized on the theme, 'Changing Trends in Information Technology, Media and Management: Post Pandemic Challenges and Prospects' in the month of February 2022

Faculty Development Programme on Research Methodology in Social Sciences

IQAC organized a 10 days Research Methodology Programme from 18th – 28th April, 2022 online sponsored by Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR).

The areas covered include, 'how to raise a research problem', 'how to review literature of the present study' and 'how to identify research gaps, conceptual framework' and 'theoretical background of research', 'formulation of hypothesis' and the 'art of developing questionnaire, 'sampling and different sampling techniques', 'use of advanced excel in data analysis, and 'writing doctoral thesis and its key components. The FDP had 369 participants from across the nation.

Programme specific Magazines to promote research

To promote research among students, different departments have taken initiative to bring out Departmental Magazines such as B.Com. Programme – Vanijyam, BAF & BBI Programme – ArthLekh, Economics Department – The Spectator, BMS Department – Magnates, BMM Department – Saamvarta B.Sc.(IGT) Department – Digital Minds and Anveshan by Research Cell.

Faculty Contribution

Faculty has contributed substantially in the syllabus revision exercise and question paper setting of T.Y. programmes of University of Mumbai. The areas included Mass Media, Management Studies, Accountancy and Information Technology. A few faculty members have authored books in their domain areas. The faculty has been invited as resource persons also at various prestigious colleges across the nation.

Library

Library of the college referred to as 'Learning Resource Center' is a hybrid library with physical as well as online resources and is open for 12 hours in the day. The current collection of the library stands at 14,237 regular books, 2177 book bank books and 69 periodicals.

To commemorate 'National Librarian's Day' on 12th August 2021, the library organized a Book Review Competition for the students and also a session for Sridora Caculo College of Commerce and Management Studies, Goa on 'Role of Libraries in the Digital Era'.

On account of 'Marathi Bhasha Pandharwada' celebration, the library organized an 'Online Book Exhibition' of Marathi books from 14th to 28th January, 2022. Library also organized Intercollegiate Quiz Events on various occasions like Independence Day, Republic Day, World Environment Day, International Women's Day, Vachan Prerna Din and Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti. Competitions like Book Review, Essay Writing, Poster Making and Sketching on account of Vachan Prerna Din were also organized by the library during the year 2021-22.

During the pandemic the library initiated a variety of services namely 'Digital Book-Shelf', 'E-Periodicals Rack', 'Virtual Book Exhibition', 'Online SDI Service', 'Saturday Fun', 'Book of the Day' etc. to provide remote library facility.

Collaborations to compete and excel

The college has entered into functional collaborations with other premier education institutions and NGO's with intentions of capacity building of students, faculty and student exchange programmes, research activities and community service. The following are the collaborations entered into during the previous years and continuing.

To promote pre-incubation and incubation activities in the campus, MOU was signed with AIC NITTE University Incubation Center Nitte, Karkala, Mangalore on 20th December, 2020.

Outreach programme for underprivileged children along with Composite School, Barkhohara, Uttar Pradesh, January 2021

As a part of our green initiative, an MOU was signed with Mission Green India for Eco bricks.

For promoting E-waste management awareness activities in the college premises, the college has entered into an MOU with Aavni Environment and Sustainability Consultancy on 30th April 2021.

For managing the Dry Waste and addressing the issue of Plastic Pollution in the college premises, a MOU was signed on 30th April, 2021 with Athak Foundation.

In order to create and promote internship opportunities for students, we have entered into collaboration with Break the Code LLP, to conduct campus interviews and provide internships for students.

To campaign and publicise gender parity in the campus, a MOU was signed with Akshara Foundation. This foundation will help to establish Gender Equality in the campus along with organising workshops for the students.

Students' Council

Ms. Ishika Shetty of SYBAMMC was selected as the General Secretary of Students' Council for the academic year 2021-2022 with 14 core committee members. The Students' Council Oath Taking Ceremony was conducted on 15th January, 2022 where the newly selected members of the core committee were officially vested with their powers and positions. Students' Council is empowered to be involved in the planning and execution of co-curricular, extra-curricular and extension activities of the college. During the year many meaningful programmes were organized by Students' Council such as Student development Programme by SEBI, celebration of teacher's day, National Youth Day, birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda, an inter-collegiate event Kaavish. Members of Students' Council also visited Snehasadan – home for the homeless, visited two local schools and engaged the school students in various programmes and distributed sanitary pads to girl students. Also organized Yoga for a healthy being from June 2021 to April 2022 showing videos of different yoga poses with instructions through social media platforms.

Cultural Committee

The Cultural Committee strongly believes that a student's overall development involves activities beyond the curriculum and therefore offers the students a platform to showcase their flairs through conducting various events. This year the events organised were Talent Hunt 1.0, Jashn-E-Diwali, Gita Jayanti, Talent Hunt 2.0, Marathi Bhasha Pandharwada, International Poetry Day and Emmorzeal.

Our students competed in 15 events at the University of Mumbai and won 2 positions in the Zonal round of Youth Festival of University of Mumbai. During 2021-2022 our students participated in various Inter-collegiate competitions and secured 68 winning positions.

Extension Services - National Service Scheme (N.S.S.), Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE) and Women Development Cell (WDC)

Currently two units of NSS are functioning with 150 Volunteers. NSS units of the college conducted a series of activities during the year which consisted of programs related to COVID-19 pandemic, Swatchata Abhiyan and health activities. The activities included are Yoga, donation drives, vaccination drives, Swacchata Abhiyan and Vikhroli Railway Station Clean-up. The other activities include Road Safety Awareness Programme, Volunteers week, Flash mob on HIV/AIDS awareness, street play on women empowerment etc. The NSS unit of the college conducted a certificate course on Capacity Building, a National level 3 days online training programme on Capacity Building and Resilience for Culture Heritage Disaster Risk Reduction jointly with National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM), organized National level Students Research Convention on Post Pandemic Development and Innovations in the Ecology, Enterprises and Economy.

During COVID-19 period, the NSS unit of the college had organized blood donation camps in the college twice and collected 147 units of blood.

The Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension has been established in our college since 2010. To facilitate the sensitization of the students to the socio-cultural realities, the department offers students extension work projects encompassing social issues. The student is awarded 10 additional marks at the final exam for a project on completion of 120 hours of work and the submission of a project report which are undertaken by degree college students. During the year 2021-22, the students registered in DLLE were 78.

Internal Committee of the college organised Samabhav -an International Film Festival of Gender Inclusion and Gender Diversity in association with MAVA(Men Against Violence and Abuse). Well known actor- producer Ms. Sonali Bendre was the chief guest. 12 films were screened over two days. The screenings were followed by discussions with actors, directors, activists and participants. More than 400 participants watched these films over two days.

The Women Development Cell of the college aims to promote gender sensitivity amongst masses. The WDC hosted various awareness and interactive programs around the calendar year focusing on gender parity, gender discrimination issues, women empowerment, women rights, cyber security. In keeping with the mission of the WDC – University of Mumbai, the college WDC aims to prevent sexual harassment at workplace and promote general wellbeing of female students teaching and non-teaching women staff in the colleges. The important activities conducted during the year include Women's Rights are Human Rights, Talk Show on Gandhian Philosophy and Women Empowerment, an Inter collegiate level webinar Gender and Popular Culture in Global India, Gender Empowerment series – documentary screening on Miss representation, Reset Your Mind, to tackle mental depressions and trauma, Distinguished Marathi Women to highlight prominent Marathi women then and now, webinar on Investors Awareness Programme for Women and on the day of International Women's Day an activity on Gender Equality in all spheres of life.

Language and Magazine Club

Marathi Language Conservation Fortnight was observed by the college. Various programmes of awareness, activity and celebration were organized by the different committees to celebrate the richness of the Marathi language and culture. The club also observed days namely Hindi Bhasha Diwas, Marathi Bhasha Diwas & Matrubhasha Diwas during the year 2021-22.

Sports and Games

During 2021-2022 some of the sports events were organized online and some of the events organized offline depending upon compulsion of the situation. Sports week was organized from 16th February to 5th March 2022. A few worth mentioning achievements include, Advaith Poonja of TYBMS secured second position in a national level throw ball competition representing Maharashtra state, Anuj Gharat of SYBMS got selected to represent University of Mumbai football team, Arham Jain of FYBMS won gold medal in boxing

competition held at Wilson College.

Incubation Center

The College has started an Incubation Centre for ideation and to provide wings to the ideation of our risk – appetite students. The intention behind this is to change the mind-set of the students from job seeking to job making. A series of activities conducted to motivate and promote start-up activities of our students. Some of the activities include, Inspirations, Brand builders, Social entrepreneurs, Own blog creation, Video making etc. Under the Government of India initiative, SAMBHAV was organised an orientation session for the students of our college

Associations and Committees

In addition to statutory committees, many associations and committees are formed course - wise and activity wise for the benefit of students. They include Commerce Association, Economics Club, Management Association, I.T. Association, Nature Club, Health Club, Theatre Club-Kalaamanch, Hoonar Club, Language and Magazine Club etc. These Associations and committees are under the charge of competent teachers as advisors and have undertaken numerous activities to unleash the potential of our students during the academic year.

Career Guidance and Placement Cell

Career Guidance activities are conducted at regular intervals in the college so as to expose students to the employment market. Incidentally, training was provided to develop soft skills like Effective Communication, Leadership, Inter-Personal Relationship, How to work in a team, How to face the personal interview, Guidance on aptitude test, How to write a good resume etc. Due to the prevailing economic situations, we could see a drop in the companies visiting the college for recruitment. The department has been working to reduce industry-academia gap by making internship, research and field visits a part of academics. This year 131 students did internship, more than 50 students did research from second and third year, 1 student made entrepreneurship based project and the department took third and second year students to field trips. Teachers and students had published 20 research papers in national and international conference. 7 groups participated in Avishkar, a university level research conclave and 1 paper got selected for finals.

The department has won many laureates for the institution and department. Akshat Aggarwal (TYBMS) got selected for final round of Avishkar, Advith Poonja (TYBMS) got recognized for outstanding performance in throw ball at national level, Rohanbahadur (TYBMS) got third position at zonal round of Youth Fest in Cartooning, Anuj Gharat (SYBMS) go selected in University football team, Swasthik Shetty (SYBMS) won Mr. Bunts at Akanksha 2022. The department won 'Overall Sports Championship Trophy' for the fifth time.

For skill development, the department conducted four certificate courses. HRM Basics for Working Professionals was introduced this year. Under 'Persona', the department conducted activities like lecture series on Company Accounts, session on Canva by Kunjal Pal (alumnus) session on Creative Commons, How to Write a Research Paper, How to Make a Blog, How to Write a Press Release. For experiential learning, apart from field Trips, the department conducted nearly 28 Capsule Activities. The department provides various knowledge sharing platforms to the students like 'The Know Show' in which three online and offline events were conducted. The Management Association which is the club of management students also provides many such opportunities. This year the department introduced a new initiative BMS Weekly for weekly business news analysis.

For career guidance, the department organized sessions by higher education institutions like Alliance, Bangalore, Ideal Academy, MAAC, IBS etc. The department organized sessions on career guidance under Crossroads. This year we organized two sessions on Scholarships for Education in Foreign Universities (Inter-Collegiate), session on Strategic Networking and Interviews by industry expert and alumnus Ms. Karishma Thakur. Sessions were also conducted on specialization, library & counselling centre. Session on stock broking was organized by alumnus, Dashrath Prajapati. For implementation based learning, the department organized 'Amalgam' – Event Management and IMC activity and 'Enrich Ecolution' for making first year students environmentally conscious.

Miss Divya Shaj, an alumni of the department, who is now a writer for 'Instant Bollywood' apprised the students on opportunities in the field of journalism.

Our time tested, experiential learning programs, namely - Filmy Friday, Y- Talk, Studio Samachaar-the online newsletter and Studio Awaaz were conducted this year too. New additions this year of Samachar review - news analysis, Samachar Somwar - Video News capsule, Samachar Fortnightly added further to the students practical experience. Department inter collegiate fest 'Kaarva' was conducted with competition on Photography and Power Point Presentation Making.





The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a Central Sector Scheme of Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. The NSS Unit of Bunts Sangha's S.M. Shetty College of Science, Commerce and Management Studies Powai consist of 2 units of 150 volunteers, where they must complete 120 hours of work at university level, college level and at an adopted area. This unit comprises of principal Dr. Sridhara Shetty as the Chairman, Dr. Vijay Vishwakarma and Prof. John Menezes are the Programme Officers, Ms. Snehal Rai - NSS Representative, Ms. Mansi Choubey - NSS Asst. Representative and Ms. Nandani Mahapatra – Red Ribbon Club (RRC) Leader.

With the motto 'Not Me But You' the NSS unit focusses on health, education & women empowerment related activities divided into four levels namely Area Based 1, Area Based 2, College Level & University Level. An orientation program for new volunteers was conducted by the NSS on National Service Scheme (NSS) Foundation Day that is on 24th September, 2021.

Area Based 1: This level includes events related to COVID-19, Pandemic, Swatchata Abhiyan (Cleanliness Drive) and Health activities. 


MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION



The Health Club will definitely continue with full dedication in the further years to benefit the teachers, students and to the maximum number of people they can reach.












HOONAR

Advaith Poonja of class TYBMS A secured 2nd position in national level throwball competition where he represented Maharashtra.


Anuj Gharat of class SYBMS B got selected in the Mumbai university football team.




10 Days ICSSR Sponsored Online RM Workshop







IPR Report

Teachers Corner

Know all about yourself in 488 pages and Rs. 599/-

If you have existential questions with no answers close by, I recommend you get hold of a book called Homo Deus: A Brief History of Tomorrow written by Yuval Noah Harari. Written in English, belonging to the Popular Science genre, the English version of this book was first Published on 8th September 2016.

Homo Deus is a sequel to the book Sapiens: A Brief History of Humankind, which was published in 65 languages and sold 40 million copies worldwide and has Bill Gates and Barack Obama in the fan list. Homo Deus, takes off from where Sapiens describes the evolution of humans from paleolithic times and the journey and challenges till renaissance. Homo Deus talks about the current capabilities and achievements of humans and predicts their future.

I read this book recently and the uncanny resemblance to the current pandemic and the prediction of a pandemic in the beginning of the 21st century in the opening chapter of the book, blew my mind away. The book is a methodical representation of information based on the author's extensive study of history and related subjects. Homo Deus- where 'Homo' refers to humans and 'Deus' to God, is a book that reflects on the god-like qualities that the humans are aiming to achieve in this 21st century. This book examines and postulates the various ways in which humans may be able to fulfill their desire for 'God' like status and their desire for immortality and happiness based on the past and the things happening in the present.

The predictions in the book are presented in an exceptional manner and make the reader ponder over the possibilities available for humans. It highlights the magnitude of human achievements and scientific discoveries and how humans have taught themselves to ride over difficult situations. There is one aspect of war which is still a challenge as we can very well see in the current Russia-Ukraine war.

The author puts a dark cast on the probability of the Internet of everything and the highly advanced computer based algorithms sidelining the humans forever. He proposes that the exceptional growth of artificial Intelligence based technology is going to make doctors obsolete eventually. Curing diseases will go beyond physical ailment to an emphasis on studying the mind and brain.

Another aspect that rattles the mind of the reader is the comparison of humans as mere biochemical algorithms and life as algorithmic data processing. Harrari, portrays a possibility of obliteration of lesser humans by intellectually superior humans. The propositions are based on a data-centric world view rather than a human-centric view, however there seems to be a ray of hope to this gloomy prediction, that humans, learning from their past and harnessing the global consciousness may change the inevitable future.

The book is written in simple language and easy to comprehend. It takes an all-encompassing view of scientific discoveries as well as philosophical developments like humanism and individualism. The reader is bound to have some learning outcomes and life changing experiences while reading the book. This book reminds the reader to be open to learning and re-inventing oneself to keep up with evolution. It recommends one to be multi-talented as that will be the need of the future. The reader should be open minded and keep their personal prejudices and ego on the side while reading this book as it may from time to time challenge the readers current understanding and opinion of the world as it is and present them with information that may threaten their current beliefs. However, I feel by the time the reader reaches the end of the book, s/he will be thinking over a lot of things taken for granted and will be enriched by the entire exercise. It is an easy simple read and I highly recommend it to one and all. It has the power to influence the way we think and look at our world and our life.

Prof Yuval Noah Harari was born in 1976 and has a PhD in History from the University of Oxford in 2002. He is currently a lecturer at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, specializing in World History. His other area of expertise include medieval history, military history and his current focus is on macro historical questions about connection between history and biology, difference between homo sapiens and animals, ethical question about science and technology in 21st century, etc.,. This brings to my mind John Donne's "For Whom the Bell Tolls", a poem written in the 17th century, a time of great political and social upheaval in England.

The villages and towns of medieval England flourished around the bell towers, and the bell acted as a timekeeper or a call to arms, or a harbinger of any event that would effect them in one way or another. Most significantly, its tolling informed the village of the passing of a citizen, and overtime the bells ringing came to be associated with death's knell.

John Donne begins his poem by stating that "No man is an island,/Entire of itself". However, in the past year, news of hoarding of essential goods, registering for vaccine doses in districts beyond one's own, such that we consume what was meant for another community or an underprivileged group of people, that probably has limited or no access to apps or technology to even be aware of the vaccine. Man lives in relation to others; we have survived largely because of the vegetable vendors, the online essential goods delivery services, the rickshaw walas who agree to drive us to and fro, the ambulance drivers, the health workers, the scientists. Each of us are but a part of the whole. Someone else's loss is my own.

Donne also beautifully elucidates that desperate times call for desperate measures, humanity must congregate together in such times as these, but it must be a congregation of people who seek to act on behalf of another, in protection of another. Maybe the Covid-19 pandemic is our bell tolling, warning us of impending danger in the form of a self-centered and greed-driven capitalist society. It is time to heed to the sound, to seek beyond ourselves and beg of the question what must I do, how must I contribute? For when the bell does toll for me may I know I had lived not selfishly.

My Coronavirus Recovery Tale

On 7thof May 2020, I underwent testing for COVID-19 at a BMC testing camp near my residence. I got myself tested as I had spent a considerable amount of time on field reporting on Coronavirus developments in nearby slum establishments along with assisting NGOs in the distribution of essentials to daily wage workers, and the families of those struggling to make ends meet.

Panic set in the moment I had gotten myself tested. Suddenly, the grim reality of contacting the virus hit me. Until then, being personally affected by the virus felt like an abstract concept. I had taken all the necessary precautions during my journalism assignments. I kept soothing and reassuring myself with the thought, "I am young and that I will not contract the virus". However, despite my best efforts at trying to put up a brave face, I was scared. The anxiety of not knowing my fate was killing me.

Was going out on assignments worth it? Is my work even appreciated? We reporters are the subject to critique and snide remarks, did I really have any obligations towards the truth? These were uncomfortable questions which crawled their way into my headspace. I spent the next day battling thoughts of my uncertain days to come and as destiny would have it...my tests came back positive.

After I received 'the call' from the BMC official confirming my ordeal, I was oddly put to ease. At least now I finally knew what was going on. My family, on the other hand, broke down in tears and were inconsolable. Looking at their despair, I tried my best to lift their spirits, without breaking down myself. I remember the last meal I had at home before leaving; its memory helped me brave through everything that was set to come my way.

I was taken to the Karve Nagar (Kanjurmarg East) quarantine facility in an ambulance. I wasn't very hopeful at the start but then things took a positive turn with the passage of time. Everyone at the facility—doctors, nurses, helpers, patients—were scared. There is this sense of uncertainty that loomed and it was killing us all from within. The first couple of days were very rough, but then we found the key to beating the virus—relationships. In the centre, I befriended other COVID patients and we walked shoulder to shoulder out of the battlefield.

A handful of the staff went an extra mile towards making the lives of the patients a little more bearable. This kept our morale high and gave us a sliver of joy in our lives' worst moments. The doctor who was assigned to our facility in the latter half of my stay there, used to bring things to eat for patients as the food at the facility was almost always inadequate, undercooked, and never arrived on time. On some days, we were also graced by insects in our food.

Overworked departments coupled with bureaucratic bottlenecks created delays in testing as well as the delivery of results. Countless patients had to stay in the facility long after their recovery because of the sluggish operations. I for one had to fight my way to get my reports back from the testing centre. And after 13 days of staying at the quarantine facility...I beat it. I beat the virus! I was allowed to go back home to my loving family. And all I can say is I'm a 'new Gaurav Sharma' in this 'new normal'. And I know that we are all going to beat this virus and then years from now it'll just be folklore, because the real vaccine is what we all have within us — humanity.

The Yakshagana Dance of Karnataka

Yakshagana or Yakshaganam is a form of folk theater that originated from the coastal Karnataka and Kasargod district of Kerala. It is a unique combination of dance, music, dialogues, colorful costumes, and heavy facial make-up. The stories of Yakshagana are mostly inspired by the Hindu epics like Ramayana and Mahabharata.

It is believed that Yakshagana originated from the ancient Bhoota-worship that we spoke about in our Tulu culture. Bhoota-kola in Tulu Nadu and Theyyam in Kerala have very similar origins. Yakshagana went on to be influenced by Sanskrit drama. That way you will notice that while Bhoota-kola and Theyyam focus more on local duties

Did you know that Yakshagana is known to have originated in small temple towns of coastal Karnataka? It further evolved with the influence of Sanskrit literature and drama. It is hard to pinpoint any one person as the founder of Yakshagana but it is believed that Narahari Tirtha is a minister in the kingdom of Kalinga introduced in Udupi.

The name literally translates to the music of celestial beings. The performances usually happen at night. Earlier it was common to have night-long Yakshagana performances. But now they have been shortened to under 3 hours. The one that we watched at Malpe beach was close to an hour.

Types Of Yakshagana:

Yakshagana is divided into two types that are Moodalpaya and Padavalapay. Moodalapalya is the old form of Yakshagana dance and is still practiced in villages where the lead singer lives. Paduvalapaya, on the other hand, is the popular version of Yakshagana in Karnataka.

Where can we watch Yakshagana in Karnataka?

Here are some suggestions on where to watch Yakshagana dance in Karnataka and many other places are there to see mostly various temples and villages also have their own troupes and host Yakshagana performances regularly. Dharmasthala temple in Mangalore the temple town of Kateel. There are a number of Yakshagana training institutes as well such as Yakshagana Kendra in Udupi

The Yakshagana season is from January to May and also happens during the Navratri season. Yakshagana is the dance of the state of Karnataka it can also be seen in some parts of the Kasargod district in Kerala

रणझुंजार छत्रपती संभाजी महाराज

हिंदुस्तानाच्या इतिहासत कमी कारकीर्द असलेले परंतु त्यांचे पराक्रम झंझावतासारखे होते. इतिहास आजही त्या काळाचा साक्षी आहे . या महान राजाचा जन्म १४ एप्रिल १६८९ रोजी पुरंदर किल्ल्यावर झाला. त्यावेळी त्यांच्या आई वज्रचुडेमंडीत सईबाईसाहेब यांची तबियत खालावली होती. त्यांचे वडिल साक्षात छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराज होते. बाळ खुप महान होते. स्वराज्यावर अफझलखान नावाचे संकट आले आले होते. छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराजांनी प्रतापगडाकडे प्रस्थान केले होते. त्यां काही काळात सईबाईसाहेबांचा राजगडावर अकाली निधन झाले. शंभुराजे आईच्या मायेला पारखे झाले होते. त्यां घटनेनंतर त्यांच्या सातही आईसाहेबांनी व त्यांच्या आजी वज्रचुडेमंडीत जिजाबाईसाहेब यांनी त्यांना खुप जीव लावला. . अफझलखान वधानंतर छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराज पन्हाळ्याच्या कैदेत अडकले त्या समयास शंभुराजे जिजाबाईकडून राजकारणाचे धडे घेत होते. नंतर ते तलवार, भाला यांसारखी शस्त्र चालवण्यात ते पारंगत झाले. पन्हाळ्यातून सुटल्यानंतर शाहिस्तेखानाची पुण्यातून पळवून लावला. छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराजांनी औरंगजेबाची सुरत लुटली. यावर चिंदून औरंगजेबाने स्वराज्यावर मिर्झाराजे जयसिंग यांना स्वराज्यावर पाठवले. मिर्झाराजे यांनी स्वराज्याची नासाडी केली. पुरंदरचा किल्ल्याचे किल्लेदार मुरारबाजी देशपांडे वीर रणांगणात धारातीर्थी पडले. छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराजांनी स्वराज्य वाचवण्यासाठी मिर्झाराजे जयसिंगासोबत तह केला त्यालाच पुरंदरचा तह असे म्हटले जाते. हा पुरंदरचा तह ११ जून १६६५ साली झाला. पुरंदरच्या तहानंतर ते साक्षात मिर्झाराजे यांच्या विनिती नुसार क्रुर औरंगजेबाला भेटायला जाणार होते. परंतु त्या अगोदर त्यांना तहाप्रमाणे २३ किल्ले व चाळीस लक्ष्य मुलुख द्यावयचा होता.

शंभुराजे ओलीस म्हणून मुघल छावणीत राहायला आले. या घटनेपासून त्यांनी राजकारणाला सुरूवात केली. मिर्झाराजे त्यांची बुद्धि बघून आश्चर्य चकीत झाले. तिथुन पुढे त्यांना छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराज यांच्यासोबत आग्र्याला गेले. छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराजांनी भर दरबारात औरंगजेबाचा पाणउतारा केला. पुढे या अपमानामुळे ते कैदौत पडले.शंभुराजे प्रतनिधी म्हणून औरंगजेबाच्या दरबारात जाऊ लागले. औरंगजेबाने त्यांना विचारले होते की हमारे पैलवांनो के साथ कुश्ती लढोंगे त्यावर शंभुराजे म्हणाले होते इन पैलवानों के साथ कुश्ती लडने में हमारी कोई शान नहीं अगर मकोई बराबरी का शहजादा है तो में अभी अखाडेंमे उतारने के लिए तयार है हा जवाब ऐकून औरंगजेब आश्चर्यचकीत झाला. पूढे शंभुराजे व शिवाजी महाराज यांच्या नशिवात कैद आली. परंतु शिताफीने औरंगजेबाच्या हातावर मिठाई ठेवत नऊ वर्षाचे संभाजीराजे व छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराज कैदैतून निसटले. महाराजांनी संभाजीराजांना सुरक्षतितेसाठी मथुरेत मोरोपंत पिगळे यांच्या नातेवाईकांकडे ठेवले. छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराज राजगडावर पोहूचून त्यांनी संभाजीराजेंना च्या मृत्यची खोटी बातमी पसरवली. त्यांचे मृत्युनंतरचे कार्य पण राजगडावर उरकले. परंतू काही काळात च संभाजीराजे सुखरूप राजगडावर आले. त्यानंतर त्यांना तहाप्रमाणे शिवाजी महाराजांनी औरंगाबादच्या सुभेदाराकडे मृहणजेच शहजादा मुरादकडे पाठवले. कारण येणाऱ्या काळात दिल्ली जिकण्याच्या योजनात तो हूकमी एक्का होता. छत्रपतींनी मुघलांशी झालेला तह औरंगजेबाने मोडल्यामुळे स्वराज्याचा विस्तार केला. शंभूराजांनी याच संस्कृत मधून बुधभुषण ,नायिकाभेद,ब्रज भाषेतून सतसातक, आजारांवर उपचार यासाठी नखशिका या सारखे महत्वत्वपूर्ण ग्रंथ रचले.

रायगड आनंदी झाला कारण शविाजी महाराज छत्रपती व सिहासनाधीश्वर झाले. प्रत्यक्ष सभासदाने वर्णन करून ठेवले पातशहीत एक मऱ्हांटा पातशहा झा ला ही गोष्ट सामान्य नाही. संभाजीराजे खऱ्या अर्थाने स्वराज्याचे अभिषिक्त युवराज झाले. आणि इंथुनच त्यांच्या खडतर प्रवासाला सुरूवात झाली. राज्याभिषकानंतर बारा दिवसात त्यांच्या आजी जिजाबाईसाहेब देवाघरी गेल्या. संभाजीराजांचा खुप मोठा आधार गेला. शंभुराजांनी वयाच्या ११ व्या वर्षी गुजरातमध्ये समशेरीची चुणुक दाखवली . फडावर त्यांचे काम वाढू लागले त्यांत त्यांना कारभाऱ्यांचे गैरप्रकार लक्षात आले. कारभारी मंडळींना ते चांगलेच धारेवर घ्यायचे. छत्रपती शविाजी महाराजांनी दक्षिणद्ग्विजयाला जाण्यापूर्वी संभाजीराजांना श्रुंगारपुरात पाठवले. युवराज संभाजी राजे दिलैरखानाला जाऊन मळाले. याला कारण असे होते की शहजादा मुरादला नामधारी दख्खनचा बादशहा बनवून दिल्लीवर आक्रमण करायचे ,दुसरे म्हणजे सर्व मराठी सरदारांना आपल्याकडे वळवायचे. परंतु यश लाभले नाही. युवराज संभाजीराजे कसेबसे दिलेरखानाच्या तावडीतून निसटले. या प्रकरणानंतर शंभुराजेवर फितुरीचे आरोप लागले परंतु यात काही तथ्य नव्हते. छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराज यांनी युवराज संभाजीराजेशी भेट घेतली. त्यांच्यात बऱ्याच महत्वाच्या मुद्द्यांवर बोलणे झाले. छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराज यांनी राज्यविभाजनाचा प्रस्ताव युवराज संभाजीराजे यांच्या समोर ठेवला परंतु युवराज संभाजी राजांनी तो प्रस्ताव नाकारला कारण त्यांना अखंड स्वराज्य हवे होते. छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराजांनी सोबत असलेल्या सरसेनापती हंबीरराव यांना युवराज संभाजी राजोंना छत्रपती द्यायचा निर्णय घेतला.

छत्रपती शविाजी महाराज पन्हाळ्यावरून रायगडाला आले. राजारामांचे लग्न लावले. परंतु अंर्तगत कलहामुळे शंभुराजेंना बोलावणे धाडले नाही. काही द्विसातच मृहणजेच ३ एप्रलि १६८० रोजी छत्रपती शविाजी महाराजांचा मृत्यु झाला. स्वराज्याचा आधार गेला. ही गुपत ठेवली. काही द्विसातच कारभारुयांनी राजारामांचे मंचकारोहण केले. नंतर कारभारी मंडळी पनुहाळ्यावर शंभराजांना कैंद्र करायला गेले. परंतू शंभुराजेरील हा कट सरसेनापतीं हंबीरराव मोहीते यांनी उधळून लावला. राजे कवी कलश, येसुबाई , रायप्पा, ज्योताजी व इतर सरदारांसह रायगडावर आले. कारभारी मंडळींना कोठडीत टाकले.नंतर त्यांना कोठीतून घरी राहायला सांगीतले व त्यांना नजरकैंद्रेत ठेवले पुढे संभाजी महाराजांचा मंचकारोहण झाले परंतु स्वराज्य अबाधित ठेवण्यासाठी त्यांना राज्याभिषक करावा लागला. ते आता स्वराज्याचे दुसरे छत्रपती होते. छत्रपती झाल्यानंतर १५ दविसानंतर बऱ्हाणप्रावर हल्ला चढवला. सातीच्या सातही पुरे धृतले. बऱ्हाणप्र च कोळसापुर केल. औरंगजेबाचा मुलगा अकबर संभाजीराजांकडे मदत मागायला आला. हे पाहून आलमगीर औरंगजेब दक्षणित आठ लाख फौज , हत्ती ,तोफा,बंदूकधारी फौज ,खजिना ,नोकरचाकर, मुघल सरदार, जनाना घेऊन उतरला. रणझूंजार छत्रपती संभाजी महाराजांनी थेट घोडा मारला तो गोव्यावर. गोव्याच्या पोर्तुगीजांना गारद केल.कारभाऱ्यांनी पुन्हा एकदा स्वराज्य मुघलांच्या ताब्यांत द्यायचा भयंकर कट संभाजीराजांनी हाणून पाडत त्यांना सुधीरगडावर हत्तीच्या पायी देण्यांत आले.कर्नाटक च्या चिक्कदेवरायाला पराभूत केल . चिक्कदेवरायाच्या मोहीमेत छत्रपती संभाजी महाराजांनी जगातील सर्वोकृष्ट बुलेटपुरुफ जैकेट तयार केले. जंजिरा मोहीमेत ९९% किल्ला ताब्यात आला होता. परंतु औरंगजेबाच्या हसनअलीखान सरदाराने स्वराज्यावर चालून आला त्यांनाही मोहीम अर्धवट सोडावी लागली. मुघलांना पार हलाल करून करून टाकले. शहाबुद्दीन, फत्तेखान सारखे अनेक सरदार रामशेज जिंक शकत नव्हते. साधा रामशेज जिंक शकत नव्हते स्वराज्य तर दुरची बात होती . अक्षरशहा द्विसरात्र संभाजीराजे स्वराज्याच्या कार्यात स्वतःला झोकून घेतले होते. मायनाक भंडारीच्या मुलाला इंग्रजांनी मारले मृहणून इंग्रजांना द्विसा तारे दाखवले.औरंगजेबाच्या बलाढ्य फौजेला द्विसा तारे दाखवले.औरंगजेबाने त्यांचे पराक्रम बघून स्वतः च्या डोक्यावरचे किमॉश काढून फेकले.

खरोखर ते सर्वाई शिवाजीराजे होते. परंतु दुदैवाने संगमेश्वराच्या कसब्या वाडयात घातकीने कैंद्र करून त्यांना ४० दिवस अशक्षर हाल केले व त्यांनी सोसले आपल्या स्वराज्याससाठी व इथल्या रयतेसाठी.खरोखर त्यांच्या सोबतचा जीवलग मित्र कवी कलश ज्यांनी अक्षरशहा राजांना प्रत्येक मोहिमैत जीवाभावाची साथ दिली. त्यांनाही संभाजी राजांसोबत पकडून आणले होते. संभाजीराजे औरंगजेबाला मृहणाले अरे औरंगजेबाला तू आमृहाला काय कैंद्र करशील उलट तूच कैंद्र झालायच हिमत असेल बाहेर पडून दाखव. संभाजीराजाना मरणयातना दिल्या . तुळापुरच्या संगमावर भीमा इंद्रायणी च्या नदीकाठी त्यांच्या शरीराचे तुकडे केले.परंतु वढु गावच्या लोकांनी त्यांचा हिमत करून अंत्यसंस्कार केले.खरोखर च छत्रपती संभाजी महाराज ज्यांची तलवार कर्नाटक पासून ते बर्हाणपूर पर्यंत तलवार गाजवणारे यांचा पराक्रमी इतिहास संपूर्ण जगभरात गाजत राहिल यात काही शंका नाही.
